Tuesday June 29th 1849

commences with fine breeze from the NW and thick weather Middle and later Part the weather more clear spoke Ship Richmond wanting 500 lbs. Saw nine whales got one Lat. 54.19. Long 150.45

Wednesday 20th Lite aries from the Westward Middle and later Part the same Lat. Saw one Russian Whale and got him. No. Ob.

Thursday 21st Lite breezes from the Westward Middle and later Part foggy so ends the day No. Ob. This day

Friday 22nd Brisk breezes from the Westward and foggy Middle and later Part Strong gales from the Westward Lat. 54.15 Long 150.58

Saturday 23rd Strong gales from the Westward Middle and later Part the same so ends

Sunday 24th Strong gales from the Westward and thick weather Middle and later Part thick weather saw Russian whale could not fasten Lat. 54.22. Long 150.20

Monday 25th Lite breezes from the Westward Middle and later Part Brisk breezes from NW Saw whales got 2 along side Lat. 54.25. Long 151.07.

Tuesday 26th Strong breezes from the S.W. Middle and later Part the same so ends the day Lat. 54.36

Wednesday 27th Strong breezes from the S.W. Middle and later Part More Moderate Lat. 54.36

Opn Ocots. 1849 (Once More)

Thursday 28th Brisk breezes from the S.W. Middle and later Part calm Lat. 54.17 Long 151.45 Saw right whale could not fasten

Friday 29th Lite aries from the Westward Middle and later Part Strong breezes from the from the Westward spoke Ship C. Price 1900. lbs. Mockrum 2800. lbs. Bragawa 4000. lbs. Richmond 3400. lbs. Gordon 1600. lbs. Warren 600. lbs. United St.

Saturday 30th Begin with lite breezes from the Eastward Middle and later Part the same Lat. 54.20 Long 152.05 spoke Ship P. Troop 3000 lbs.

Sunday July 1st Lite breezes from the Eastward Middle and later Part the same Saw one whale and got him so ends

Monday 2nd Lite breezes from the Eastward Middle and later Part the same saw one Russian whale could not fasten Lat. 47.30 Long 150.40

Tuesday 3rd Still lite aries from the Eastward Middle and later Part the same Saw six R. Russian Whales. Mist. one Lat. 54.39 Land in sight

Wednesday 4th Begin with calm Middle and later Part fine breezes from the Westward Saw six R. Russian whales got none Lat. 54.16 Long 151.08

Thursday 5th fine breezes from the Westward Middle and later Part the winds Strong from the same Quarter Lat. 54.00 Saw one Russian whale so ends
