Sunday August 5. 1857.

 Sailed with light airs from the South and foggy Middle and later Part Pleasant saw Russian whals could not fasten Lat. 58.57. Long 10 miles

Monday. 6th Fine breeze and fine weather winds N Lat. 58.50
Saw no whals this day

Tuesday. 7th Begins with fine breeze from the North and clear Middle and later Part the same Lat. 58.23.

Wednesday. 8th Light breeze from the North and fine weather Middle and later Part the same Lat. 59.55
the Boat went ashore and got a lot of fish

Thursday. 9th Light airs from the South and fine weather Spoke the Mary and Susan food Biscuit from John Cloghouse Whals so ends the day

 Friday. 10th Strong breeze from the S.W. and foggy Middle and later Part the same Saw Russian whals and got one Lat. 60.10.

Saturday. 11th Strong gale from the S.W. and thick weather Middle and later Part the same so ends the day & said in site

 Sunday. 12th Strong gales from the S.W. and thick weather Middle and later Part the same Saw Russian whals

Monday Begins with strong gales from the S.W. and thick weather Middle and later Part winds N.E. and Strong

 Tuesday. 14th Begins with brisk breeze from the Eastward Middle and later Part winds S.W. and thick weather saw Russian Whals fastened to one and Drawed so ends the day

 Tuesday. 15th Light breeze from the S.W. and Rainy Middle and later Part the same so ends Saw Russian whals could not fasten Lat. about 59.50

 Wednesday. 16th Light breeze from the North Middle and later Part winds S.W. Saw Russian whals got one Lat. 60.45

 Thursday Begins with calm Middle and later Part Strong gales from the S.W. saw Russian whals could not fasten Spoke Ship Henry Newland of New Bedford 600. lbs. Master of Whistick. 800. lbs.

Friday. 18th Strong gales from the S.W. Middle and later Part the same Lat. 59.44. Long 158.50
