

Ship Huntress Toward Ender

Thursday October 25th 1849
commenced with fine breeze from the
Eastward born M. J. S. Maave in sight
Dist 50 Miles Steering for it at 10 P.M.
came to anchor in 20 fathoms of water
Lay B. day took the anchor and
proceeded to Mahoo
came to anchor out side the reef
& could not get in for 16 days
came in to Honolulu Harbor the
Middle of November Left the first
day of December for a crew and home.

Monday December 2nd 1849
commenced with fine breeze from
the E. N. E. at 3 P.M. Boats away
for home born S. S. E. Middle and later
Part fine breeze from the E. N. E.
Lat. 19. 14.

Monday 3rd fine E. N. E. Trades
born S. E. Middle and later Part
the winds E. N. E. Lat. 19. 50

Tuesday 4th fine lite breeze from
the Eastward heading S. S. E.
Middle and later Part the winds E
heading S. S. E. Lat. 16. 07 Long 157

Wednesday 5th Breeze from the E.
heading S. S. E. Middle and later Part
winds E N E. Lat. 13. 18

Thursday 6th Breeze from
the E. N. E. Middle and later
Part the same Lat. 10. 53

Sandwich Islands 1849

Friday 7th of December 1849
commenced with Brisk breeze from
the E. N. E. Middle and later Part
the winds E. Lat. 08. 13

Saturday 8th Brisk breeze from
the East. Middle and later Part
winds S. S. E. 110 Cbs.

Sunday 9th Begins with Brisk
breeze from the East S. S. E.

Middle and later Part the same
Lat. 6. 23 North Long 155. 38
154. 44

Monday 10 Brisk breeze from the
S. S. E. heading S. S. E.
Middle and later Part calm so ends

Tuesday 11th Begins with Squalls
from the East and Rain Middle
and later Part Lite breeze from the S. E.
Lat. 5. 24 Long 155. 32

Wednesday 12th Lite breeze from the S. S. E.
Middle and later Part calm so ends
one said in sight
the day Lat. 5. 40

Thursday 13th calm Middle
& later Part Brisk breeze from the
S. E. Lat. 5. 41 Long 155. 28

Friday 14th Brisk breeze from the
S. E. Middle & later Part the same
Lat. 04. 00 Long 153. 30

Saturday 15th Strong gale from the
S. S. E. Middle and later Part the
same Lat. 04. 30 Long 154. 16
