Saturday May the 13 day year 1832 all these 24 hours fine breezes and foggy at 2 past 6 P.M. took in all sail at 5 at 11 made all sail saw several finbacks and porpoises and other small fish  
Lat 28 30 North Long 153 41

Sunday May the 14 day year 1832 all these 24 hours strong breezes squally rainny and foggy sun thunder and lightning at 10 at 11 M set the fore and main topsail and jib saw several finbacks  
Lat 28 42 North Long 153 27

Monday May the 15 day year 1832 the first part of these 24 hours fine breezes the middle and latter foggy and calm saw several finbacks at 2 past 6 P.M. took in all sail but the main topsail delish reefed  
Lat 28 14 North Long 152 51

Tuesday May the 16 day year 1832 all these 24 hours strong gales squally foggy and rainny at 6 P.M. took in all sail but the main topsail and foresail at 10 at 11 M set the foresail  
Lat 28 58 North Long 152 25

Wednesday May the 17 day year 1832 the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes squally rainny and foggy the middle and latter part more moderate set the fore sail and fore and main top sail  
Lat 29 37 North Long 152 14 E

Thursday May the 18 day year 1832 the first part of these 24 hours fine moderate breezes but foggy the middle and latter part strong gales squally and rainny sun thunder and lightning  
Lat 30 30 North Long 153 40

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Fri day May the 19 day year 1832 the first part of these 24 hours strong gales the middle and latter part more moderate at 2 past 6 P.M. took in all sail but the main top sail delish reefed at 5 at 11 M set the fore sail and the fore and main top sail at 8 at 11 M saw the Ship *Storabellan* of Sackarbar  
Lat 30 12 North Long 154 38 E

Saturday May the 20 day year 1832 the first part of these 24 hours fine breezes the middle and latter part the same at 1 P.M. spoke the Ship *Storabellan* of Sackarbar with 1800 barrels of Spum Oil Capt Peirson  
Lat 30 19 North Long 154 55 E

Sunday May the 21 day year 1832 the first part of these 24 hours light breezes the middle and latter part strong gales at sunset saw two ships to windward of us at 2 past 10 P.M. one of them ran down to us and spoke it proved to be the *Almon* of Sydney at 3 at 11 M delish reefed the top sail fore and aft  
Lat 29 57 North Long 154 48 E

Monday May the 22 day year 1832 all these 24 hours strong gales squally rainny and foggy at 2 past 6 P.M. took in all sail at 5 P.M. kill one hog saw several fish of the Whale kind cold jimmies  
Lat 29 28 North Long 154 27 E

Tuesday May the 23 day year 1832 the first part of these 24 hours strong gales squally rainny foggy the middle and latter part more moderate at 2 past 11 at 11 M set the fore sail fore and main top sails  
Lat 29 44 North Long 154 07 E
