breezes the middle and latter part strong
gales rainey foggy etc P M tuck in
the fore and main top sail
Lat 30 28 North Long 154 11 E

the first part of these 24 hours strong
gales equally rainey and foggy the middle
and latter part more moderate at 2 past 8
P M set the fore sail fore and main
top sail duhel reefed but not one reef out
of the main top sail and set the main sail

the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes
equally rainey and foggy the middle
and latter part more moderate at 5
P M made all sail saw several fin-
backs Lat 29 53 North Long 153 20

the first part of these 24 hours fine breezes
the middle and latter part light breezes
at 6 P M saw ship at 9 P M
spoke the Ship Flashing of London
Lat 30 13 North Long 153 E

the first part of these 24 hours light
breezes the middle and latter part strong
breezes at 6 P M saw three or
three large whales bore tow boats
but got none the Flashing bore tow
boats but with no success whether
have luck on mis conduct is doubtful

the first part of these 24 hours strong
breezes the middle and latter part
moderate breezes at 10 P M the boat
came aboard from the Flashing west
spoke Lat 30 52 North Long 152 44 E

weather saw several finbacks seen jump-
ing and porpoises at 5 P M unlashed the
fore top sail and bent another

all these 24 hours fine pleasant breezes and
clear saw several finbacks and other
fish of the whale kind all the watch
in play in repairing the fore top sail
Lat 29 40 North Long 153 21

the first part of these 24 hours fine light
breezes the middle and latter part foggy
rainey and strong breezes at 8 P M
spoke the Ship Thornabellian of Lachar-
boon Lat 29 11 North Long 152 30

Friday

2 day

1832
the first part of these 24 hours strong
breezes equally rainey foggy the middle
and latter part more moderate at 4
P M about even on board from the
Thornabellian for yarning hild were hoisted
Lat 28 40 North Long 153 14

Saturday

the first part of these 24 hours light breezes
the middle and latter part strong gales
at 7 P M saw 3 whales bore and got one
Lat 29 32 North Long 153 30
