

Journal of a Whaling Voyage

Sunday the first part of these 24 hours strong gales at 2 P.M. took in all sail  
Sun the 4 day at 4 P.M. took in the main top sail  
at 5 P.M. cut our whale away from along side and took the fore part in on deck the middle and latter part more moderate saw whips in four sets of whales  
1832 Lat 30 13 North Long 152 37 E

Monday all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather  
Sun the 5 day saw whales learn and repaired its and kept it again at 10 P.M. saw whales learn all the boats but got none  
1832 Lat 29 11 North Long 153 38

Tuesday all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather  
Sun the 5 day saw whales learn and got one and cut him in the same day at 6 P.M. saw whales again learn and got none  
1832 Lat 28 30 North Long 154 18 E

Wednesday the first part of these 24 hours calm the middle and latter part fine breezes saw Whales all these 24 hours learn the boats four times but got none  
1832 Lat 28 42 North Long 154

Thursday all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light breezes saw several fishbacks  
Sun the 7 day at 2 past 6 P.M. took in all sail and at 5 P.M. made all sail again  
1832 Lat 29 41 North Long 153 18

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Friday all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light breezes saw Whales going very quick to the S.W. learn the boats but got none  
Sun the 8 day year 1832 Lat 29 11 North Long 153 39 E

Saturday all these 24 hours pleasant weather and fine breezes saw the Ship Strablon of Copenhagen and another Ship to the wind and several fishbacks  
Sun the 9 day year 1832 Lat 29 39 North Long 152 51 E

Sunday these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light breezes saw tow sail but no whale saw one Ship abiding Oil made all sail and took it in again as usual  
Sun the 10 day year 1832 Lat 30 13 North Long 152 15 E

Monday the first part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather the middle and latter part sunny foggy and rainy at 2 past 10 P.M. saw Whales learn and got tow saw tow Ships at distance  
Sun the 11 day year 1832 Lat 30 24 North Long 152 47 E

Tuesday the first part of these 24 hours light winds and foggy we cut in our whales and got the two weeks under way and got the hands overboard saw tow sail  
Sun the 12 day year 1832 Lat 30 30 North Long 153 00 E

Wednesday all these 24 hours strong breezes squally and foggy saw the Ship Factory Libanus of Sydney finished hauling the hoist and began on the 13 day  
Sun the 13 day year 1832 Lat 30 01 North Long 153 45
