jimmies and other small fish

year 1832

at 1 P M saw Whales here?
and got one
Lat 31 53 North Long 152

27 day
year 1832
all these 24 hours fine pleasant
weather all hands were played in
eating the whale at 1 P M
he got to sail
Lat 32 12 North Long 152 44

28 day
year 1832
the first part of these 24 hours squally
rainy and strong breezes the middle
and latter part more moderate
at 8 P M saw Whales here
and struck two and saved one and
got one half store
Lat 33 15 North Long 152 25

29 day
year 1832
all these 24 hours strong breezes
and squally at 1 P M began
cutting at 6 P M began to
hoist out our oil
Lat 33 19 North Long 152 40

Saturday
June the
30 day
year 1832
all these 24 hours strong breezes and
squally at 1 P M found heaven
at 8 P M saw Whales here and
got two Lat 33 33 North

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Sunday
July the
1 day
year 1832
the first part of these 24 hours fine breeze
the middle and latter part strong breezes and
squally all hands were played in cutting in our
Whales and hauling their cut
Lat 34 04 North Long 153 20 E

Monday
July the
2 day
year 1832
all these 24 hours strong breezes and squally
saw Whales two or three times brought
the after hales and stode down run oil
Lat 33 47 North Long 153 50 E

Tuesday
July the
3 day
year 1832
the first part of these 24 hours strong
breezes the middle and latter part squally
and rainy finished stinging down run oil
Lat 33 17 North Long 152 53

4 day
year 1832
the first part of these 24 hours strong
breezes the middle and latter part more
moderate at 2 P M spoke the ship
lady black whaler of Sydney
Lat 32 42 North Long 152 37

year 1832
these 24 hours strong gales and squally
rainy and foggy saw several ships
made no sail
Lat 32 45 North Long 152 57

Friday

6 day
year 1832
all these 24 hours strong breezes squally
rainy and foggy visible the main
top sail beat weather
Lat 32 31 North Long 153 19

Saturday
July the
7 day
year 1832
the first part of these 24 hours strong
breezes the middle and latter part
more moderate we found the main top
sail
