Tuesday all these 24 hours strong gales equally
August and rainey at 7 A M set the four
the 2 day sail at 3 P M tuck in the four sail
year and main top sail
1832 Lat 33 41 North Long 152 47

Wednesday all these 24 hours strong gales equally
August and rainey at 10 A M set the
the 3 day main top sail and four sail at 6
year P M tuck in the four sail
1832 Lat 34 02 North Long 152 53 E

Thursday the first part of these 24 hours strong
August gales the middle and latter part more
the 4 day moderate but squally and rainey set
year the four and main top sail about night
1832 main sail and jib and spritsail
Lat 33 43 North Long 152 47 E

Friday the first part of these 24 hours strong
August breezes the middle and latter part
the 5 day fine pleasant weather and light breezes
year at 5 A M made all sail
1832 Lat 33 15 North Long 152 31

Saturday the first part of these 24 hours calm
August the middle and latter part light
the 6 day breezes at 2 P M whisked the
year main top sail and went under them
1832 Lat 22 21 North Long 152 39

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Sunday the first part of these 24 hours fine
August pleasant at 2 P M saw "Whales" and
the 7 day and got one the middle and latter part
year the same at 5 A M began cutting and
1832 finished at 2 past 11 A M
Lat 32 11 North Long 152 47 E

Monday the first part of these 24 hours fine
August pleasant weather the middle and latter
the 8 day part light squally and rainey
year 1832 Lat 32 00 North Long 152 25 E

Tuesday All these 24 hours fine pleasant weather
August and light breezes saw several "Whales"
the 9 day saw and spoke the Ship "Hunting"
year of New Bedford capt with 12 masts
1832 out 500 barrels
Lat 31 32 North Long 152 13

Wednesday the first part of these 24 hours fine
August pleasant weather and light breezes
the 10 day the middle and latter part strong
year breezes saw the Ship "Raven" of
1832 London in pursuit of Whales
Lat 31 18 North Long 152 52

Thursday all these 24 hours fine breezes and pleasant
August weather breeches the four sails and
the 11 day stood down again of oil of 85 barrels
year 1832 Lat 31 37 North Long 152 47

Friday the first part of these 24 hours strong
August breezes the middle and latter more
the 12 day moderate at 9 A M saw two large
year "Whales" but got none
1832 Lat 31 20 North Long 152 31 E
