Monday August the 13 day year 1832  
 the first part of these 24 hours light breezes the middle and latter part light and calm saw tow sails and several other things of no profit  
 Lat 31-12 North Long 152 31 E

Tues day August the 14 day year 1832  
 all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light breezes saw tow sails and several other things not worth mentioning in  
 Lat 31-20 North Long 152 20

Wednes day August the 15 day year 1832  
 all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and fine breezes and saw tow light squalls of rain spoke the Ship Marcus of Fairhaven 1250 barrels of oil  
 Lat 31-11 North Long 152 41

Thurs day August the 16 day year 1832  
 the first part of these 24 hours fine pleasant breezes the middle and latter part light breezes and calm spoke the bark Ship Dexter of New Bedford 1500 barrels with 500 hundred barrels  
 Lat 30 47 North Long 152 37

Fri day August the 17 day year 1832  
 all these 24 hours light breezes and calm saw six sail of Ships spoke the <sup>Albany</sup> Mercury of Edgartown 2600 barrels and the Sun of Nantucket 3200 barrels  
 Lat 30 35 North Long 152 28

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Satur day August the 18 day year 1832  
 all these 24 hours light breezes and calm saw several ships but rather dark with murthering  
 Lat 30 21 North Long 152 19 E

Sun day August the 19 day year 1832  
 the first part of these 24 hours calm the middle and latter part light breezes and light squalls of rain saw several sail  
 Lat 30 12 North Long 152 33 E

Monday August the 20 day year 1832  
 the first part of these 24 hours light breezes the middle and latter part calm saw several ships spoke the ship Marcus of Fairhaven  
 Lat 29 54 North Long 153 20

Tues day August the 21 day year 1832  
 the first part of these 24 hours calm the middle and latter part fine breezes saw tow or three sail and abundance of finbacks  
 Lat 29 46 North Long 154 11

Wednes day August the 22 day year 1832  
 the first part of these 24 hours calm the middle and latter part light breezes and fine weather saw several ships  
 Lat 30 19 North Long 154 57

Thurs day August the 23 day year 1832  
 all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather saw large number of jumpters heard one but thinking that they were whales  
 Lat 31 11 North Long 155 18
