Sun day these 24 hours fine pleasant
May weather and light breezes and
the 5 day a strong current setting to the
year 1833 Westward
Lat 14° 8 South Long 91 38

Monday all these 24 hours fine pleasant
May weather and light breezes
the 6 day at 4 PM spoke the Channel
year 1833. Lat 1.21 South Long 91.32

Tues day the 7 day year 1833 the first part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and bright breezes the latter part strong breezes Lat 37 Miles South

Wednesday All these 24 hours fine pleasant
clear weather and light breezes
the 5 day saw two Ships and a Schooner
year 1835 from Payto
Lat 8 miles South Long 91.29

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Thurs day all these 24 hours fine pleasant
May weather and light breezes saw
the 9 day tow Ships and the boat and
year 1833 went on board of the Schooner
Lat 48 Miles North Long 91.20

The day the first part of these 24 hours
the 10 day fine pleasant weather the latter
year 1833 part squally and rainier
and snow. Liners saw
sail to theeward of us
Lat 32 Miles North Long 9139

Saturday all these 24 hours fine pleasant
 May weather and strong breezes saw
 the 11 day we sail at 5 P.M. we were
 year 1833 with in a short distance of Redond
 neck Lat 23 miles North Long 71.5

Sunday the first part of these 24 hours
May strong linears and squally
the 12 day and rainier the latter part
year 1855 calm spoke the Ship Parvise
of London Lat 14 Nels North

Monday all these 24 hours fine pleasant
May weather light breezes and
the 13 day cabin saw four Ships on
year 1833 spoke one of them
Lat 32 Miles North Long 163

Tues day All these 24 hours light breezes
(May) and calm saw four Ships spoke
the 14 day the Ship "Rambler" of Nantucket
year 1833 Lat 52 Miles North Long 91.31
