Wednesday the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes at daylight saw the 19 day the same and last of shore year 1833 at 7 P.M. last in again Lat 4.04 South Long 81.54

Thursday the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes the latter part the 20 day more moderate saw a Brig year 1833 at 11 P.M. hauled to the beam Lat 4.37 South Long 81.57

Friday the first part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather the 21 day iridell and latter part strong breezes took in the topgallants Lat 4.21 South Long 81.42

Saturday all these 24 hours moderate breezes and cloudy saw along the 22 day number of finbacks and hump backs Lat 4.28 South Long 82.51

Sunday the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes the latter part moderate breeze the boat and the 23 day twice the current and found it strong I W by W at the rate of 1 1/2 knots per hour Lat 4.45 South Long 82.17

Monday all these 24 hours strong breezes and cloudy one foggy saw the 24 day several finbacks year 1833 Lat 4.23 South Long 82.31

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Tuesday the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes the middle and the 25 day latter part more moderate year 1833 Lat 4.32 South Long 81.47

Wednesday the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes took in the the 26 day topgallant sails and flying jibs year 1833 Lat 4.59 South Long 82.00

Thursday the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes the latter the 27 day part moderate breezes and many herring saw one black fish board and got one Lat 5.37 South Long 81.23

Friday all these 24 hours light breezes the 28 day cloudy saw two ships and spoke one of them the Sarah of New York Capt Barney year 1833 Lat 5.02 South Long 82.19

Saturday all these 24 hours light breezes and cloudy saw the the 29 day Sarah again and finbacks and hump backs with out number Lat 4.33 South Long 81.43

Sunday the first part of these 24 hours fine pleasant weather the latter the 30 day part strong breezes year 1833 Lat 4.41 South Long 81.32
