year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather fitted a new fore top mast and sent it up and put the riggin over the head of it Mr Davis is no better.

Sun day
July
the 14 day
year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all hands on shear on liberty except four or five Mr Davis remains the same.

Mon day
July
the 15 day
year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all hands imployed in repairing riggin and Mr Davis is worse we were oblig'd to confine him

July
the 16 day
year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather sent up the fore top sail yard and the main top gallmast the Ship Sarah and Orion of Newberk left here this day

Wednesday
July
the 17 day
year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all hands imployed in vares work a bought the riggin Mr Davis is no better

Thurs day
July
the 18 day
year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather sent down the main top mast and fitted the riggin the Bark Vermont came in this day for two men that she left the other day

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all hands imployed in fitting the main top mast riggin sent up the main top sail yard the younster Shats Scorer Dogfish came in this day the Doctor of her went to see Mr Davis

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather sent up the top gal-lants yards fore and aft Mr Davis is better

year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all hands on shear on liberty for the day Mr Davis is recovering quite fast and English Bridg came in this day

July
the 22 day
year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all hands imployed in netting the riggin and vares other work a bark Ship came this day from the leeward

Tues day
July
the 23 day
year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and worn all hands imployed in netting the riggin the bark Shute of Newberk came in this day 5 Men out

Wednes day
July
the 24 day
year 1833

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather all hands imployed in heading sails the Schooner Paulina left this day
