Tues day all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light breezes saw several finbacks and blackfish
 August the 6 day year 1833 Lat 6° 51 South Long 84° 23

the first part of these 24 hours
 Wednes day fine pleasant weather the middle and latter part cloudy and strong breezes saw great numbers of blackfish and finbacks
 August the 7 day year 1833 Lat 6° 58 South Long 85° 14

the first part of these 24 hours
 Thurs day fine pleasant weather latter part strong breezes at 2 P.M. saw Whales leave and struck tow and got one and one boat stove
 August the 8 day year 1833 Lat 7° 19 South Long 86° 13

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light breezes all hands imployed in cutting and boiling the Whales
 Fri day August the 9 day year 1833 Lat 7° 44 South Long 87° 43

the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes the latter part moderate repaired the stowen boat saw several finbacks
 Satur day August the 10 day year 1833 Lat 8° 38 South Long 88° 19

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather and light breezes saw several finbacks
 Sunday August the 11 day year 1833 Lat 9° 12 South Long 88° 52

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all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather at 11 P.M. saw Whales leave and got one forty barrel Whales
 Mon day August the 12 day year 1833 Lat 10° 01 South Long 89° 37

the first part of these 24 hours strong breezes the latter part more moderate saw several finbacks and finished hauling
 Tues day August the 13 day year 1833 Lat 10° 43 South Long 90° 37

the first part of these 24 hours
 Wednes day August fine pleasant weather and light breezes the latter part squally
 the 14 day year 1833 Lat 10° 38 South Long 91° 18

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather knock out and stowed the 15 day our Oil be turned decks
 Thurs day August the 15 day year 1833 Lat 12° 07 South Long 92° 54

all these 24 hours fine pleasant weather fixed the jib and fly jib, gais and repaired the old boat and truck up the shelling and wood of the Decks
 Fri day August the 16 day year 1833 Lat 13° 47 South Long 92° 38

the first part of these 24 hours light breezes the latter part calm saw one large Whale and leave the boats but did not get him
 Satur day August the 17 day year 1833 Lat 15° 08 South Long 93° 18
