

Remarks on Board Saturday July 6th 1844
 Begins with light breezes from the N. steering E by S.
 middle part light winds from the western board. latter
 part fresh breezes from S. S. W. three sail in sight.

So Ends Lat by Obs 39° 44' N. Long by Chron 59° 44' W.

Sunday July 7th Begins with fresh breezes from S. S. W.
 steering E by S. middle part wind S. W. set topmast and
 top gallant studding sails. latter part strong breezes took
 in main royal. flying jib and top gallant studding sail.

So Ends Lat by Obs 39° 45' N. Long by Chron 59° 50' W.

Tuesday July 8th Begins with strong breezes from the S. W.
 steering East by South at 2 P.M. carried away fore topmast
 studding sail boom. at 2 P.M. took in top gallant sails. at 4 P.M.
 double reefed topsails. middle part strong gales from S. S. W.
 took in mizen topsail. jib and mainsail. latter part heavy
 gales.

So Ends No Obs -

Remarks July 9th Begins with heavy gales from S. S. W.
 steering E by S. middle part the same. latter part more
 moderate let the reef out of the topsails. set jib and main-
 sail and main top gallant sail. So Ends Lat by Obs 40° 55' N.

Long by Chron 59° 37' W.

Wednesday July 10th Begins with thick rainy weather windy
 from E. S. E. heading S. E. middle part light windy from E.
 set fore and mizen top gallant sails. latter part windy
 from S. W. steering E. S. E. set topmast and top gallant
 studding sails. hands employed in ships duty. three sail
 in sight steering E. So Ends Lat by Obs 40° 39' N.

Long by Chron 48° 47' W.

Remarks on Board Thursday July 11th
 Begins with light winds from the S. W. steering E. S. E. with
 all sail out. middle and latter parts cloudy steering E by S.
 hands employed in ships duty. So Ends Lat by Obs 41° 16' N.

Long by Chron 46° 31' W.

Friday July 12th Begins with moderate breezes from
 S. W. steering S. E. with cloudy weather. nothing in sight
 middle and latter parts thick rainy weather. So Ends

Lat by act 40° 36' N. Long by act 48° 40' W.

Saturday July 13th Begins with thick squally weather
 wind from S. W. steering S. E. took in flying jib and main
 royal and studding sails. middle and latter parts the same
 spoke barque Wode of New Bedford clean.

Long by Chron 39° 06' W.

Sunday July 14th Begins with light breezes from S. W. steering
 S. E. with all sail out three sail in sight. middle and
 latter parts pleasant. one sail in sight steering Eastward.

Lat by Obs 39° 37' N. Long by Chron 36° 32' W.

Monday July 15th All these 24 hours pleasant breezes from
 S. W. steering S. E. by E. two sail in sight steering East
 hands employed in turning in fore and main rigging.

Lat by Obs 39° 33' N. Long by Chron 35° 57' W.

Tuesday July 16th Begins with light wind from W by S. steering S by E.
 middle and latter parts the same at 3 A.M. saw the isle of Flores
 bearing S by E. 4 ships and one barque laying off and on at
 Flores. So Ends. No Observation.
