

Remarks Sunday July 28<sup>th</sup> 1844

Commences with light airs from E.S.E. and cloudy steering South with all sail set middle and latter parts light wind from S.E. and cloudy. So Ends Lat by act 18° 19' North Long by chro 24° 48' West

Monday July 29<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from S.E. and pleasant at 11 PM made the island of St Anthony one of the Cape St Vences bearing S.P.W. distance 20 miles. middle part light breezes running in for the land latter part went on shore for recruits. So Ends this day.

Tuesday July 30<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fine weather employed in trading for hogs, goats and fowls. at sundown came on board. James Dick, Chas. Valentine and Wm. Marshall deserted. middle part laying off and on trying to catch the deserters. latter part caught Wm. Marshall. Shipped 4 Portuguese. So Ends this day.

Wednesday July 31<sup>st</sup>

Commences with fine weather employed trading and hunting deserters at 1 PM caught Chas. Valentine. James Dick came to the boat of his own accord, came on board and kept off to the South. middle part pleasant, latter part light airs from S.E. So Ends Lat by Obs 18° 57' N. Long by chro 24° 41' W

Thursday August 1<sup>st</sup>

Begins with calm and pleasant weather at 2 PM two black fish lowered boats and took one to the ship. middle part fresh breezes running for the isle of Pigo. At 8 AM went on shore to trade. So Ends.

Remarks Friday August 2<sup>nd</sup> 1844

Begins with strong breezes from the S. Grand squally. on shore trading for hogs at sundown came on board and kept off steering S by W. shipped one Portuguese. middle and latter parts pleasant employed in ships duty. So Ends Lat by Obs 14° 51' North Long by Chro 24° 23' West

Saturday Aug 3<sup>rd</sup>

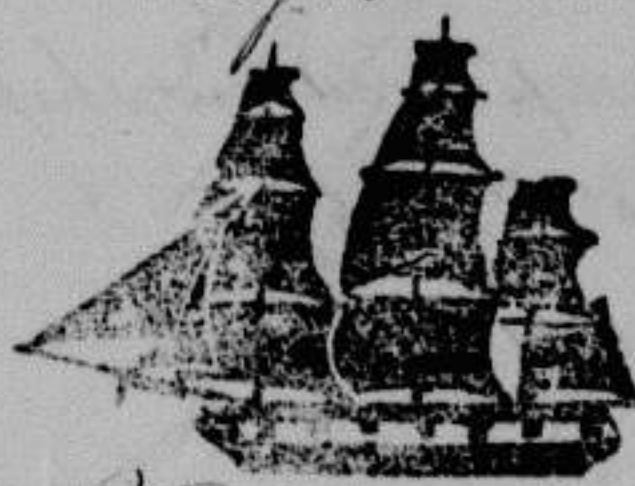
Commences with light airs from the North steering South with all sail set. two sail in sight steering South middle and latter parts fresh winds and pleasant. hands employed in ships duty. So Ends Lat by Observation 12° 58' North Long by Chro 24° 23' West

Sunday Aug 4<sup>th</sup>

The first part of these 24 hours light winds from the Northern boards steering South with all sail set. middle and latter parts pleasant winds from East. two sail in sight steering South. So Ends Lat by Obs 11° 50' N. Long by chro 23° 47' W

Monday Aug 5<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light breezes from the East steering South at 2 PM spoke ship Splendide of Cold Spring with no oil at 3 PM spoke ship Huntress of New Bedford with no oil. middle and latter parts pleasant. hands employed in ships duty. So Ends Lat by act 10° 56' N. Long by act 22° 51' West



Tuesday Aug 6<sup>th</sup>

Commences with light airs and bafflin at 4 PM fresh winds from the West steering South middle part the same, latter part wind N.E.S.W. and squally. Splendide and Huntress in company. So Ends. No Obs.
