

Remarks Monday Aug 26th 1844

Begins with light air from S. S. E. steering S. by E. with all sail set middle part the same. latter part pleasant, unbent the fore topsail and fore sail and bent new ones. hands employed mending sails. So Ends Lat by Obs $26^{\circ}15'$ South Long by Chron $20^{\circ}06'$ West

Tuesday Aug 27th

Commences with light winds from the Northern board and pleasant steering S by E with all sail set middle part the latter part light air from East steering South, employed setting up rigging and mending sails, one sail in sight. So Ends Lat by Obs $27^{\circ}20'$ South. Long by Chron $19^{\circ}37'$ West

Wednesday Aug 28th

Begins with light air from E. S. E. and pleasant heading South unbent misseentopsail and bent another "middle and latter part the same. So Ends Lat by Obs $28^{\circ}34'$ South Long by Chron $19^{\circ}29'$ West

Thursday Aug 29th

These 24 hours begins with "light breeze from E by S heading South" at 4 P.M. unbent fore and maintopsails and bent others, one sail in sight middle part thick rainy weather, latter part strong winds from S. E. and squally, took in top gallant sails and flying jib at 10 A.M. single reefed topsails, employed in ship duty. So Ends Lat by Obs $30^{\circ}08'$ Long by Chron $19^{\circ}23'$ West

Friday Aug 30th

Begins with fresh gale from S. E. heading S. P.M. at 4 P.M. double reefed topsails and took in spankers middle part strong gale. latter part employed fitting new waist, and bent boats So Ends Lat by act $32^{\circ}43'$ Long by act $19^{\circ}09'$ West

Remarks Saturday August 31st 1844

Begins with strong gale from E. N. E. and squally heading S. E. under double reefed topsails with a heavy sea in middle and latter parts "the same. So Ends Lat by Obs $33^{\circ}00'$ South Long by act $17^{\circ}45'$ West

Sunday Sept 1st

Commences with strong gale from S. E. with thick weather steering S. E. at 6 A.M. took in jib and mainsail, and misseentopsail, middle part close reefed fore and maintopsails, latter part wind from the North steering S. E. with thick rainy weather at 7 A.M. took in fore sail. So Ends Lat by act $36^{\circ}54'$ South Long by Chron $14^{\circ}10'$ West

Monday Sept 2nd

Begins with strong gale from the North with thick rainy weather steering S. E. under close reefed fore and maintopsails at 2 P.M. took in fore topsail and hove too. heading Eastward, middle part moderate. latter part made all sail heading East. So Ends Lat by Obs $36^{\circ}57'$ South Long by Chron $13^{\circ}00'$ West

Tuesday Sept 3rd

Begins with light air and bafflin at 1 P.M. saw Western d. Aunha bearing E. S. E. distance 50 miles. middle part light breeze from S. E. and cloudy. latter part strong wind from E by S heading South and bearing East. So Ends this day - No Observation.

Wednesday Sept 4th

Begins with fresh winds from E by S heading S. at 2 P.M. took in top gallant sails at 4 P.M. double reefed topsails and lashed ship heading E. S. E. at 6 P.M. strong gale took in jib and mainsail. Unacceptable bearing E by N. latter part close reefed topsails. So Ends. No Obs.
