

Remarks Thursday September 5th 1844

Begins with strong gales from the S.E. under close reefed topsails at 6 PM took in fore and mizen topsails and fore sail and hove too. heading East at daylight made sail heading E.S.E. distant bearing E.S.E. dist 25 miles. latter part running in for the land. So Ends Note.

Friday Sept 6th

Begins with pleasant breezes from S.W. at 1 PM went in to the land with the boats at sunset came on board. middle part laying off and on latter part fresh winds from W.N.W. went in with the boats at 10 AM

came on board strong breezes from W.N.W. spoke barge Pembroke of New London with 400 bbls of oil and spoke ship Huntress of New Bedford with no oil. So Ends No observation.

Saturday Sept 7th

Commenced with strong winds from W.N.W. and squally driving off and on at 4 PM took in sail middle part more moderate made sail latter part spoke barge Pembroke and barge Lad-mug of Sag Harbour with 900 bbls of oil. So Ends this day. No Observation.

Sunday Sept 8th

Begins with light air from the North gaining with Pembroke and Lad-mug at 6 PM fresh breeze steering South middle part fresh gales took in top gallantsails and mainsail. latter part took in fore and mizen topsails and double reefed main topsail wind N.W. So Ends No Ob.

Remarks Monday September 9th 1844

Begins with strong gales from W.S.W. took in the foresail and close reefed main topsail heading South at 6 PM set close reefed mizen topsail middle part the same. latter part more moderate. one sail in sight made all sail. So Ends Sat. by Ob 39° 0' S. Long by Chron 9° 45' West.

Tuesday Sept 10th

Begins with strong breezes from S.W. heading S.S.E. at 6 PM wind from S. tacked ship heading W.S.W. one sail in sight middle part light air and latter part fresh gales from South. saw one right whale lowered boats but did not get fast. So Ends this day Sat. by Ob 39° 45' South Long by Chron 8. 51' West.

Wednesday Sept 11th. Begins with heavy gales from the S. at 1 PM hove too heading W.N.W. middle part the same. at 12 midnight saw Poughke island bearing N.W. dist 1 mile. latter part wind from W. tacked ship. one sail in sight. So Ends this day. No Observation.

Thursday Sept 12th

Begins with strong breezes from W heading in fore the land at 4 PM spoke ship Phoenix of New London with 450 bbls of oil and Bengal of New London with 1 whale middle and latter parts strong gales. Bengal in sight. So Ends. No Observation.

Friday Sept 13th

Commenced with heavy gales from the west heading S by W. land bearing S by E. Bengal in sight. at 4 PM strong gales laying too under close reefed main topsail. middle part the same. latter part moderate made sail heading in for the land. So Ends. No Ob.
