

Remarks Saturday September 14th 1844

Begins with strong breezes from the North heading West at 2 P.M. took in top gallant sails and flying jib at 4 P.M. double reefed topsails at 5 P.M. took in jib and mainsail and double reefed topsails took in spanker at 6 took in fore and misson topsails here too heading N.W. land bearing N by E. dist 5 miles. 5 sails in sight. middle part the same. latter part moderate made sail standing in for the land. So Ends this day. No Observation.

Sunday Sept 15th

Begins with fresh winds and pleasant trying to get up to the land 5 sails in sight wind N.W. land bearing N.W. dist 20 miles at 6 P.M. hard gales from N. close reefed main topsails middle part the same heading N. latter part wind shifted to N.W. above ship head N by W. with strong gale. So Ends this day with a fair prospect of never getting up to the land. So Ends

Monday Sept 16th

Begins with strong breezes from the West middle part the same. latter part "pleasant boats" in shore saw several right whales. So Ends this day

Tuesday Sept 17th

Begins with light breezes from the West and pleasant boats in shore at sunset came on board. middle part pleasant laying off and on. latter part boats in shore saw whales struck one and he took the line. boats came on board. seven sail in sight. So Ends this day. No Observation

Remarks Wednesday Sept 18th 1844

Commences with strong breezes from the S. S. W. Standing off and on under double reefed topsails at 4 P.M. left the island steering East middle and latter part thick dirty weather far by Oct 41° 20' S Long by chro 8. 19' W

Thursday Sept 19th

Begins with strong winds from the S. S. W. steering East under double reefed topsails with thick weather at 6 P.M. let the reefs out. middle part thick. latter part the same. So Ends N by E

Friday Sept 20th

The first of these 24 hours breezes from the South with thick dirty weather steering East middle part bafflin winds. latter part strong breezes from S. W. steering East nothing in sight hands employed in ships duty. No Observation

Saturday Sept 21st

Begins with strong winds from S. W. with foggy weather steering E. S. E. with all sail set nothing in sight middle and latter part the same. hands employed in ships duty. far by Oct 38° 37' South Long by chro 3. 44' East

Sunday Sept 22nd

Begins with fresh breezes from S. W. steering S. E. by E. set fore top mast studding sail, several finback whales in sight middle and latter part fresh breezes from the Northern boards steering S. E. by E. hands employed in ships duty. nothing in sight So Ends this day — far by Oct 39° 00' South Long by chro 6° 22' East
