

Remarks Tuesday October 22<sup>nd</sup> 1844

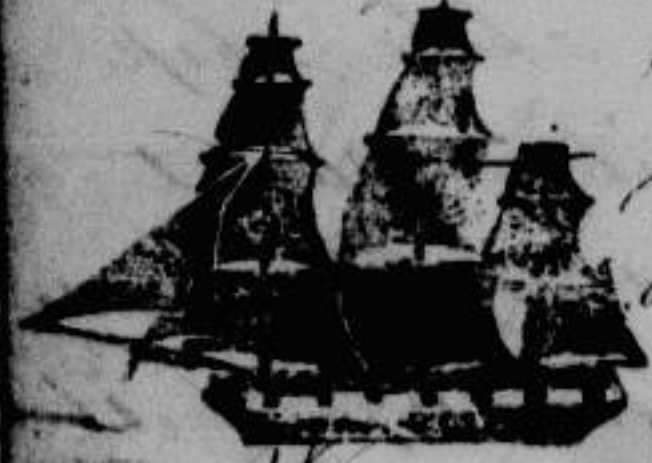
Begins with light breeze from the North and pleasant - saw  
whales lowered body but could not get fast - at sunset took in  
sail middle part pleasant - at daylight made sail a 8 at 10  
saw whales lowered but could not get fast - latter part the same  
hands employed in ships duty. Lat by Ob<sup>y</sup> 34° 33' South  
Long by Chr<sup>o</sup> 69° 47' East.

Wednesday Oct 23<sup>rd</sup>

Begins with breeze from the North steering South East with pleasant  
weather plenty of finbacks in sight and one sail. at sunset took  
in sail heading East middle part pleasant. at daylight made  
sail standing on different tacks. To Endy Lat by Ob<sup>y</sup> 34° 27' South  
Long by Chr<sup>o</sup> 71° 15' East.

Thursday Oct 24<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light breezes and pleasant - at 4 P.M. spoke  
ship Champion of New Bedford with 150 bbls of  
sperm oil. at sunset took in sail. middle part pleasant  
at daylight made sail nothing in sight. Lat by Ob<sup>y</sup> 34° 10' S  
Long by Chr<sup>o</sup> 70° 10' E.



Friday Oct 25<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light winds from the South steering West middle  
and latter part the same, saw several finbacks. one sail in  
sight hands employed in ships duty. Lat by Ob<sup>y</sup> 33° 51' South  
Long by Ob<sup>y</sup> 69° 32' East.

Saturday Oct 26<sup>th</sup>

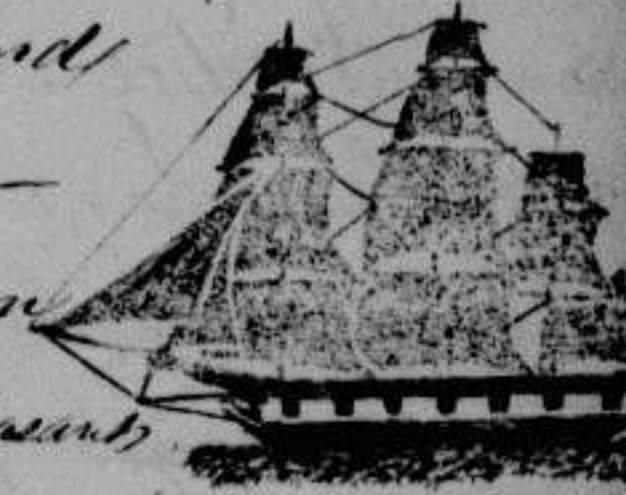
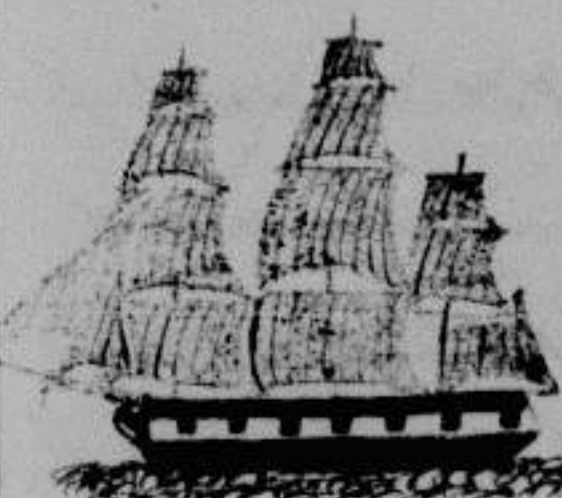
Commences with light air from the S.E. steering N.W. two  
sail in sight middle and latter part the same. hands employe  
in ships duty. Lat by Ob<sup>y</sup> 33° 27' S. Long by Chr<sup>o</sup> 69° 35' East.

Remarks Sunday October 27<sup>th</sup> 1844

Begins with light air and bafflin several finbacks in sight -  
untent the jib and bent another at sunset took in sail. middle  
part pleasant at daylight made sail. latter part pleasant. hands  
employed in ships duty. To Endy Lat by Ob<sup>y</sup> 33° 37' South  
Long by Chr<sup>o</sup> 68° 17' East.

Monday Oct 28<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh breezes from the North and pleasant at 12 M  
spoke ship Sally Ann of New Bedford  
with one whale. at 5 P.M. spoke ship -  
Champion of New Bedford 120 bbls Sperm  
at sunset took in sail. middle part pleasant  
at 10 A.M. kept off steering South to sail in sight, and 100  
whales - To Endy this day Lat by Ob<sup>y</sup> 31° 34' South  
Long by Chr<sup>o</sup> 67° 40' East.



Tuesday Oct 29<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from the North steering South under  
top sails and courses nothing in sight that looks like a whale  
at sunset took in sail at daylight made sail with fresh winds  
from the N.W. and rainy. To Endy. No Observation.

Wednesday Oct 30<sup>th</sup>

Begins with thick dirty weather plenty of finbacks in sight but  
no right whales middle part wind from the West and pleasant at  
daylight made sail heading S.S.W. a 9 a.m. locked ship heading  
North. hands employed in ships duty. To Endy this day  
Lat by Ob<sup>y</sup> 35° 13' South  
Long by Chr<sup>o</sup> 68° 25' East.
