 gale latter part the same. So Ends with No Ob

Friday Dec 6th

Begins with strong breezes from the Northern board and
 foggy middle and latter part pleasant nothing in
 sight. employed in ships duty. So Ends Lat 36° 47' N
 Long by chro 74° 48' E

Saturday Dec 7th

Begins with light air from the Western board and
 pleasant. nothing in sight. middle and latter parts
 the same. employed in ships duty. So Ends Lat 36° 42' N
 Long by chro 74° 19' E

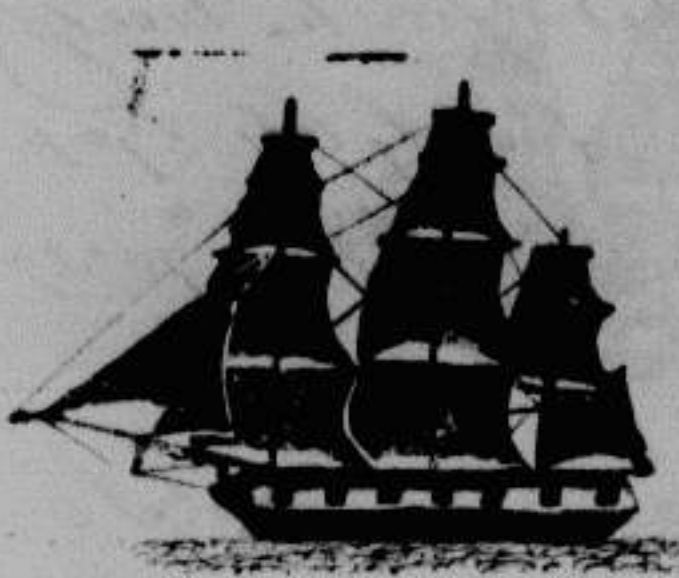
Sunday Dec 8th

Begins with light breezes from the Western board and
 pleasant steering East middle part pleasant. latter
 part the same. So Ends employed in ships duty.
 Lat by obs 36° 15' N Long. 74° 40' East

Monday Dec 9th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Northern board and
 pleasant steering S. S. W. middle and latter parts the
 same. nothing in sight. employed in ships duty.
 So Ends Lat by obs 37° 33' South
 Long by chro. 74° 27' East

Remarks Tuesday December 10th 1844
 Begins with fresh breezes from the Northern board
 steering South at 4 P.M. spoke ship Midway of New



Bedford with 8 whales. middle part pleasant
 latter part strong breezes from N. N. E. at 9 A.M.
 saw whales lowered boat could not get fast
 came on board at 11 P.M. saw more whales
 lowered but did not strike two sail in sight.
 cutting. So Ends Lat 38° 10' N Long 74° 13' E

Wednesday Dec 11th

Begins with strong breezes from the Northern board with
 thick weather. middle part heading W. S. W. latter part
 strong breezes with thick weather. employed in ships duty
 So Ends. Lat by Obs. 38° 33' South
 Long by chro 75° 05' East

Thursday Dec 12th

Begins with fresh breezes from the S. W. heading to
 the Southward. middle part the same. latter part
 strong. nothing in sight. employed in ships duty.
 So Ends. Lat by Obs. 37° 25' South
 Long by chro 74° 46' East

Friday Dec 13th

Begins with strong gales from the Western board
 middle and latter part pleasant heading Eastward
 nothing in sight. employed in ships duty. So Ends
 Lat by obs. 37° 10' South
 Long by chro 75° 36' East
