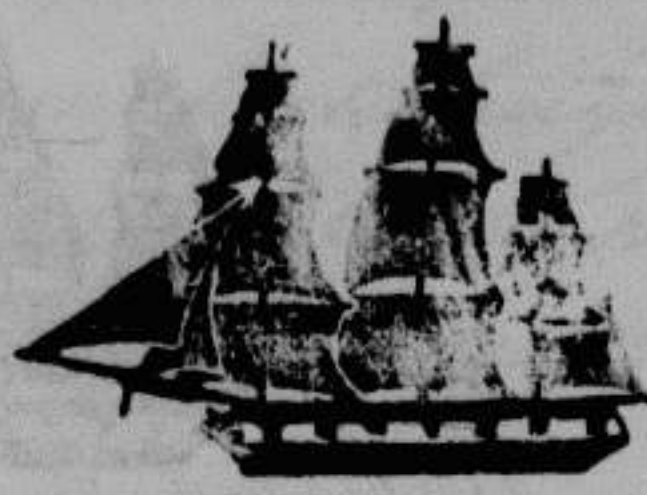
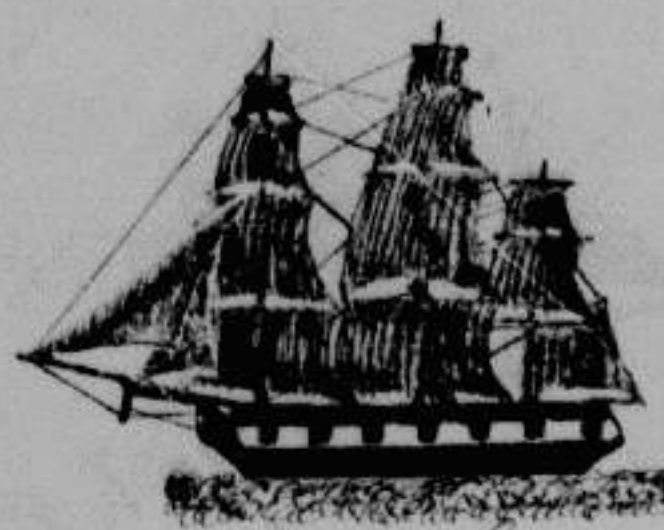


Remarks Monday December 23<sup>rd</sup> 1844

Begins with strong breezes from the Western board and squally steering S.E. by E. with all sail set at 5 P.M. spoke ship Thomas Dickson of Sag Harbor with 3 whales and spoke ship Bengal of New London with 75 bbls Sperm and 2 right whales, middle and latter parts strong breezes. So Ends Lat  $39^{\circ}43'S$



Long by chro  $94^{\circ}30'E$

Tuesday Dec 24<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh gales from the West steering E. S.E. at 3 P.M. split the mainsail and went it middle and latter parts strong gales with rain squally So Ends Lat by Obs  $39^{\circ}49'S$   
Long by chro  $98^{\circ}29'E$

Wednesday Dec 25<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong gales from Western board steering E. S.E. with frequent rain squally middle and latter parts fresh gales and cloudy all sail set. So Ends Lat by Obs  $40^{\circ}10'S$   
Long by chro  $101^{\circ}35'E$

Thursday Dec 26<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh breezes from Western board steering E. S.E. with all sail set middle part thick rainy weather latter part fresh gales. So Ends. Bound to Lord Howe's island, nothing in sight. Lat by Obs  $40^{\circ}10'S$   
Long by chro  $100^{\circ}00'E$

Remarks Friday December 27<sup>th</sup> 1844

Commences with fresh gales from the S.W. steering E. by S. with nothing in sight middle and latter parts the same hands employed in ships duty. So Ends with No Observation

Saturday Dec 28<sup>th</sup>

All these 24 hours light air from the Western board and bafflin. employed mending sails. So Ends. No Obs.

Sunday Dec 29<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours begins with fresh breezes from S. S.W. with thick weather went the foresail and bent another middle part pleasant breezes from the Western board steering E. by S. latter part strong breezes saw several finbacks. So Ends Lat by Obs  $41^{\circ}11'S$   
Long by chro  $113^{\circ}11'E$

Monday Dec 30<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from S.W. with rain squally steering E. by S. middle part fresh gales latter part thick rainy weather employed in ships duty. So Ends. Lat by act  $41^{\circ}15'S$  South  
Long by act  $118^{\circ}17'E$  East

Tuesday Dec 31<sup>st</sup>

Commences with strong breezes from S. S.W. with cloudy weather steering E. by S. with all sail set middle part the same latter part fresh gales hands employed in ships duty. So Ends this day and year.

Lat by Obs  $41^{\circ}21'S$  South  
Long by chro  $122^{\circ}15'E$  East
