

Remarks Wednesday January 1st 1845

This year commences with strong gales from the N. & W. steering E. S. E. at 4 on look in fore and mizzen topsail with thick rainy weather and a heavy sea in middle part the same. latter part fresh breezes from the Western board, employed mending sails. So Ends Jan 42° 31' S Long by chro 126° 25'

Thursday January 2^d

Begins with fresh breezes from the western board with pleasant weather steering E. S. E. nothing in sight middle part moderate breezy. latter part strong gale with strong gale look in fore and mizzen topgallant sails. So Ends. Lat by obs 43° 13' South Long by chro 129° 40'

Friday Jan 3^d

Begins with fresh gales from the N. W. steering E. S. E. with thick squally weather. middle part heavy rain squally look in maintop gallant sail and double reefed fore and mizzen topsail. latter part the same. So Ends this day. Lat by obs 44° 04' South Long by chro 133° 53' East

Saturday Jan 4th

Begins with strong breezes from the N. & W. steering E. by S. middle part squally latter part moderate made all sail. with nothing in sight. So Ends. Lat by obs 44° 28' South Long by chro 137° 28' East

Sunday Jan 5th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Western board steering East half South. middle part moderate. latter part squally. So Ends Jan 44° 40' South Long 140° 58' East

Remarks Monday January 6th 1845

Begins with light ^{fresh} from the Western board with frequent rain squalls steering East. at 5 P.M. saw whales breaved



boats struck one and killed him and took him to the ship and cut him in middle part started by work. latter

part boiling. So Ends this day. Lat by act 45° 00' South Long by chro 141° 53' East

Tuesday Jan 7th

Begins with fresh breezes from the N. W. steering East. middle and latter part moderate employed boiling. So Ends Jan 46° 39' S Long 144° 58'

Wednesday Jan 8th

Begins with fresh breezes and squally, finished boiling. latter part thick rainy weather. wind from the N. W. employed stowing down. So Ends this day. Lat by act 46° 20' South Long by act 145° 50' East

Thursday Jan 9th

Begins with strong gale from the N. W. and thick rainy weather steering East. middle part heavy gale hove to under close reefed maintop sail. latter part set close reefed topsails steering N. E. So Ends this day. Lat by obs 46° 09' South Long by chro 149° 39' East

Friday Jan 10th

These 24 hours begins with strong breezes from the Western board steering N. & E. under double reefed topsails. latter part moderate made all sail. Lat by obs 42° 48' South Long by chro 157° 29' East
