

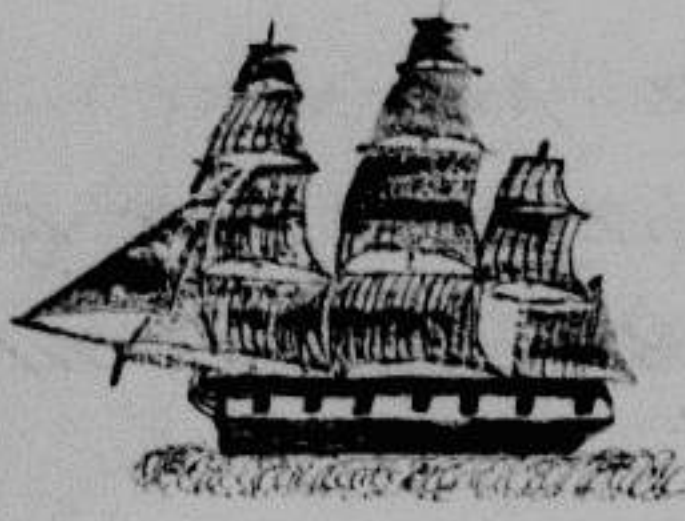
Remarks Tuesday January 21st 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading E. N.E. took in fore and misser top gallant sails at 5 P.M. made Ford Howe island bearing E by S distance 20 miles at 6 P.M. strong breezes took in maintop gallant sail, middle part fresh breezes, latter part strong breezes working up to the land.

So Ends. Lat $31^{\circ}11'$ Long $159^{\circ}19'$

Wednesday Jan 22nd

Begins with fresh breezes from S.E. middle part the same, latter part went on shore for Potatoes, ship Source of New London at the islands. That boats the cooper descent. So Ends this day with No Observations —



Thursday Jan 23rd

Begins with light breezes from the S.E. and pleasant took on board one half a ton of Potatoes, middle part light air from S.E. left the island heading S.E. latter part the same. So Ends with land in sight.

Friday Jan 24th

Begins with light breezes from the Eastern board heading S.E. at 4 P.M. tacked ship heading S by N middle and latter part calm. So Ends with land in sight.

Saturday Jan 25th Begins with light air and baffling middle and latter part light breezes from the N.W. then E.S.E. So Ends — Lat by obs $30^{\circ}33'$ South — Long by obs $159^{\circ}08'$ East —

Remarks Sunday Jan 26th 1845

Begins with light breezes from the N.W. and pleasant steering E by S middle and latter part the same employed in ship's duty. So Ends Lat by Obs $31^{\circ}31'$ Long by obs $161^{\circ}34'$ East

Monday Jan 27th

Begins with light winds from the Northern board with pleasant weather steering E by S middle part wind N.E. latter part the same, one sail in sight. Lat $32^{\circ}34'$ Long $163^{\circ}49'$ East

Tuesday Jan 28th

Begins with light breezes from the S.E. with light squalls of rain heading E.S.E. middle part fresh breezes heading S.E. latter part the same. Lat by Obs $33^{\circ}51'$ South Long by obs $163^{\circ}39'$ East

Wednesday Jan 29th

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.E. heading E.S.E. at 3 P.M. saw sperm whales, lowered boats could not get fast, saw the Source take one sperm whale, middle and latter part moderate. So Ends this day Lat by Obs $34^{\circ}53'$ South Long by obs $166^{\circ}26'$ East

Thursday Jan 30th

Begins with light breezes from the S.E. heading E.S.E. at 1 P.M. saw sperm whales, lowered boats could not get fast, saw the Source take whales, middle and latter part light breezes. So Ends this day. Lat by obs $35^{\circ}29'$ South Long by obs $167^{\circ}00'$ East
