

Remarks Friday January 31st 1845

Begins with light breeze from the Southern board and at 2 P.M. saw sperm whales towed boats struck three one took the line killed the other two and took them to the ship got two boats stoves at 6 P.M. began cutting one of the whales and let the other lay alongside all night middle part minding. at 7 a.m. cut the other whale. So Ends with frequent rain equally. No Obs.



Saturday Feb 1st

Begins with fresh breeze from the S.W. started the try-works. middle part joined from E. N.E. heading North latter part winds S. N.E. heading East with thick dirty weather. So Ends this day. No Observations

Sunday Feb 2^d

Begins with fresh breeze from E. S.E. heading North middle part continual rain slacken down try works at 7 a.m. cleared up started try works again. employed in boiling. So Ends. Lat by Observation 33° 26' N.

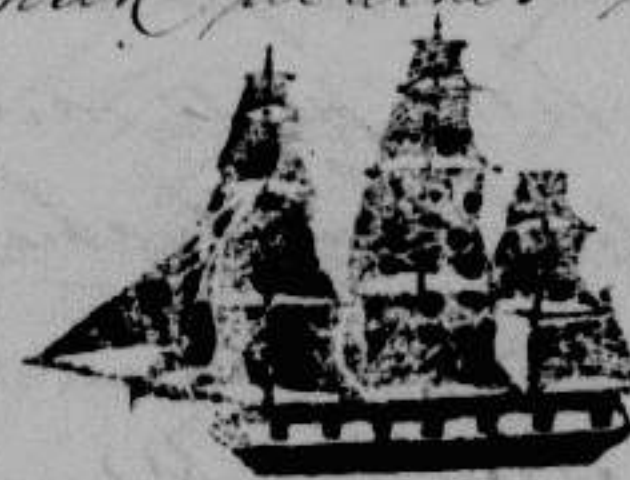
Monday Feb 3^d Begins with strong breeze from the North heading E by S under short sail employed boiling middle part heading N. E. by E finished boiling. latter part raining employed mending boats. So Ends this day No Obs.

Remarks Tuesday February 4th 1845

Begins with fresh breeze from S. by E heading N. E. with thick dirty weather. middle part equally. latter part thick weather employed repairing boats. So Ends. No Obs.

Wednesday Feb 5th

Begins with fresh breeze from the Western board with thick weather steering N.E. middle part cloudy spoke ship Salem of New Bedford 19 tons out with 1500 bbls of oil. latter part thick raining weather. wind from the S.E. employed in ships duty. So Ends. No Obs.



Thursday Feb 6th

Begins with thick rainy weather wind from the S.E. steering N.E. middle part strong gales from the S.W. took in jib and mainmast and fore and main topgallant and double reefed the main. So Ends Lat by Obs. 32° 08' Long 170° 25' E.

Friday Feb 7th

Begins with fresh breeze from the Southern board steering N.E. by E middle and latter part moderate breeze from S.E. steering N.E. by E employed setting up head stays and repairing sails. Lat by Obs. 31° 56' N. Long by Act. 170° 36' E.

Saturday Feb 8th

Begins with pleasant breeze from the S.E. heading N.E. middle part strong breeze took in topgallant sails latter part fresh gales with thick rainy weather under single reefed topsails S.E. by E. Lat by Obs. 28° 15' N. Long by Act. 170° 13' E.
