

Changed the day

Remarks Sunday February 9th 1845
Begins with fresh gales from the Eastern board with thin
rainy weather heading S. & E. under single reefed topsails—
middle part hard squally. latter part hard gales lost the
main sail close reefed main topsail and hove too, So Ends
Lat by obs. 28° 31' S. Long by obs. 179° 41' W.

Monday Feb 10th
Begins with fine pleasant weather wind from S. & E. by E. heading
S. & E. employed mending sails middle and latter parts sailing
Lat by obs. 27° 42' S. Long by obs. 178° 31' W.

Monday Feb 10th
Begins with light breezes from the S. & E. steering S. & E. with
cloudy weather middle and latter parts pleasant employed
setting up rigging. So Ends Lat by obs. 28° 04' S.
Long by obs. 177° 20' E.

Tuesday Feb 11th
Begins with fresh breezes from the S. & E. steering S. & E. with
pleasant weather. employed on the rigging. middle part squally
with rain. latter part pleasant. stowed down. So Ends
Lat by obs. 26° 21' S. Long by obs. 173° 26' W.

Wednesday Feb 12th
Begins with fresh breezes from the S. & E. and pleasant steering
S. & E. middle part pleasant. latter part the same at 4 PM
saw the island of Eoa bearing S. by W. dist 31 miles. So Ends
steering for the land. Lat by obs. 21° 45' S. South
Long by obs. 174° 39' E.

Remarks Thursday February 13th 1845
Begins with fresh breezes from E. S. & E. and squally run
to leeward of the island at 4 PM went on shore at sunset came
on board. middle part laying off and on. latter part on shore
trading at 11 came on board. So Ends this day.

Friday Feb 14th
Begins with fresh breezes from the S. & E. running for the island
of Tongatabu. at 5 PM took a pilot. at 8 PM came to an anchor
in Vangiea road. middle and latter parts fresh gales and
squally with rain. So Ends this day.

Saturday Feb 15th
All these 24 hours strong breezes from the S. & E. with frequent
rain squally. smoking ship to destroy the rats. So Ends

Sunday Feb 16th
Begins with thick squally weather. middle and latter parts
fresh gales. smoking ship. So Ends this day.

Monday Feb 17th
All these 24 hours heavy gales from the S. & E. with thick
squally weather. let go the second anchor. So Ends

Tuesday Feb 18th
Begins with fresh breezes from the Northern boards, and
rainy employed getting off wood and water, and trading with
the natives. So Ends
