

Remarks Wednesday February 19th 1843
All these 24 hours fresh breezes and squally
employed wooding and watering. So Ends

Thursday Feb 20th

All these 24 hours pleasant weather employed
painting ship and setting up topmast and top gallant
rigging and tacking. So Ends this day

Friday Feb 21st

All these 24 hours pleasant. employed painting ship
and tacking. Barque Jane & Eliza came in and anchored
Henry Peterson. W^m Marshall. W^m Newton and Denis
Dorin deserted. So Ends this day

Saturday Feb 22nd

All these 24 hours pleasant finish painting and wood-
ing and watering and condemned the Jane & Eliza and
shipped Chas. Perkins one of her crew. So Ends

Sunday Feb 23rd

All these 24 hours pleasant breezes at 8 AM got
underweigh and stood out to the Northward in company
with the Spence. employed stowing anchors and chains

Monday Feb 24th All these 24 hours pleasant breezes from
East heading N. N. E. saw several small islands. So Ends
Lat by obs 17° 30' S. Long by obs 174° 54' E.

Remarks Thursday February 25th 1843

Begins with fresh breezes from the Eastern board heading
N. N. E. middle part pleasant. latter part saw sperm whales
lowered boats could not get fast. So Ends. Lat by obs 17° 36' 9
Long by obs 174° 45' 6

Wednesday Feb 26th

Begins with fine breezes from the Eastern board steering
South. middle and latter part frequent rain squally. So Ends
Lat by obs 15° 51' S. Long by obs 174° 28' 8

Thursday Feb 27th

These 24 hours begins with light breezes from the East-
ern board with frequent rain squally. middle and latter
part the same. So Ends. Lat by obs 14° 14' South
Long by obs 173° 29' East

Friday Feb 28th

Begins with fresh breezes from E by S. middle part the
same. at daylight made Wallis island bearing West - Dist
15 miles. putting in for the land. So Ends. Lat by obs

Saturday March 1st

Begins with light breezes from the Eastern board run
in under the land and went on shore at dark came on
board. middle part standing off and on. latter part the
same spoke barque Indian of
London with 400 bbls of sperm
oil. 18 miles out. So Ends this day
