

Remarks Tuesday April 15th 1848

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southern board steering N. W. by S. at 5 p.m. strong breezes from S.W. and squally took in topgallant sails. middle part wind from S.W. and squally. latter part wind from the Northern board lashed ship heading West and set topgallant sails. So Ends. 15th Ob.

Wednesday April 16th

Begins with fresh breezes from S.E. by S. heading S.W. at 3 p.m. took in topgallant sails. middle and latter part pleasant. So Ends. Lat by Observation 34° 45' N Long by Chron 116° 13' East

Thursday April 17th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Eastern board steering N.W. by S. with all sail set. middle part strong breezes took in topgallant sails. latter part heavy gale from the East took in jib and mainsail and double reefed topsails at 5 a.m. took in mizen topsail. So Ends. Lat by Obs 36° 35' N Long by Chron 117° 03' E

Friday April 18th

Begins with heavy gales from the Eastern board steering N.W. under double reefed topsails saw several finbacks and plenty of whale feeds. middle and latter part pleasant. So Ends. Lat by Obs 38° 49' N Long 117° 30' E

Saturday April 19th Begins with fresh breezes from the Eastern board heading S.W. by E. middle part under short sails. latter part pleasant saw two humpbacks. So Ends. Lat by Obs 39° 11' N Long by Chron 117° 51' E

Remarks Sunday April 20th 1848

Begins with light breezes from the Eastern board heading S.W. by E. plenty of finbacks in sight middle part under short sail steering S.E. latter part pleasant steering S.W. by E. So Ends. Lat by Obs 40° 52' N Long by Chron 117° 51' E

Monday April 21st

Begins with fresh breezes from S.E. steering S.W. by E. at 4 P.M. saw two right whales lowered boats struck killed and he sunk lost one line and one half lost 9 rows and two lances came on board saw more whales lowered boats could not get fast at sunset took in sail at daylight made sail saw whales lowered boats could not get fast. So Ends. Lat 41° 18' N Long 118° 52' East

Tuesday April 22nd

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southern board heading W. S.W. at 11 p.m. saw whale lowered boats struck one and he took the line came on board saw several whales lowered boats struck one killed and took it to the ship and took in sail at daylight commenced cutting with three thirty weather saw several whales. So Ends. Lat 42° 06' N Long 119° 06' E

Wednesday April 23rd

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southern board employed cutting at 9 P.M. finish cutting and commence boiling. middle part weather latter part the same employed boiling. So Ends. Lat 42° 06' N Long 119° 06' E
