

Remarks Thursday April 24th 1843-

Begins with fresh gales from S.S.E. standing on different tacks with thick rainy weather. employed boiling middle and latter part thick fog with rain. employed boiling saw one right whale lowered boats could not get fast. So Ends. S. O. by

Friday April 25th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Western board with thick weather at 8 pm finished boiling. middle cleared up latter part heavy gales from N. by S. employed stowing down oil. So Ends. Lat by O. by 41° 30' Long by chro 148° 10' E.

Saturday April 26th

Begins with strong gales from the Western board heading S.S.W. under close reefed main top sail. employed stowing down at 4 P.M. finish stowing and set the foresail saw several whales middle part moderate at daylight set single reefed top sail at 8 A.M. 266 whales lowered boats struck me and had to cut came on board and took in sail. with strong gales from the S.W. So Ends this day. Lat by O. by 41° 30' North Long by chro 148° 51' E.

Sunday April 27th

Begins with strong gales from the Western board heading S.S.E. under short sail at daylight made sail at 10 A.M. saw whales. lowered boats struck killed and he sunk came on board. got one boat stove. So Ends. Lat by O. by 41° 30' North Long by chro 148° 39' East

Remarks Monday April 28th 1843-

Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. by W. employed in repairing boats at 5 P.M. saw whales lowered boats struck me and the iron dreak at 5 saw more whales lowered struck and had to cut at dark came on board and took in sail. middle part pleasant. latter part saw whales lowered boats struck me and killed and he sunk came on board. So Ends this day. Lat by O. by 42° 00' North Long by chro 147° 50' East

Tuesday April 29th

Begins with light airs from S.S.W. and pleasant saw plenty of whales lowered boats could not get fast. at sunset took in sail. middle part thick fog. latter part strong gales from the Northern board with thick rainy weather. So Ends. Lat by O. by 41° 50' N Long 147° 43 East

Wednesday April 30th

Begins with strong gales from the Northern board with thick rainy weather. middle part hard gales took in foresail and close reefed main top sail. latter part equally with snow. saw several whales. So Ends. No Observation

Thursday May 1st Begins with strong gales from the S. heading E.S.E. at 4 P.M. more ship heading S.W. wind from N.E. by saw whales middle part more moderate at daylight made sail at 10 A.M. saw one whale going quick to windward. So Ends. No Observation
