

Remarks Friday May 2^d 1843

Begins with light breezes from E S E heading North with cloudy weather no whale in sight. middle part under short sails latter part strong breezes from E S E heading S by E with thick dirty weather. So Ends. Lat by obs 42° 58' North
Long by act 145° 30' East

Saturday May 3^d

All these 24 hours heavy gales from E S E heading N under double reefed maintop sail with fog and fresh breeze equally. So Ends. Lat by obs 42° 58' North
Long by act 145° 30' East

Sunday May 4^d

Begins with heavy gales from the Southern board heading E S E with thick dirty weather middle part more moderate at daylight made sail light bafflin windy no whale in sight. So Ends. Lat by obs 42° 58' North
Long by act 145° 19' East

Monday May 5^d

Begins with light airs from S S W heading S E nothing in sight. middle part light breezes latter part fresh breeze from the Southern board heading E S E. saw one right whale going quick. So Ends. Lat by act 41° 21' North
Long by act 145° 10' East

Tuesday May 6^d

Begins with fresh breezes from S S W with thick fog middle and latter part the same saw one whale. So Ends. Lat by act 41° 10' North
Long by act 145° 32' East

Remarks Wednesday May 7^d 1843

Begins with thick fog with wind from the S N by W heading S S E at 1 p.m. more ships heading S N by W middle part thick fog at 8 a.m. fog cleared up saw one whale lowered boats could not get fast. So Ends. Lat by obs 41° 41' North
Long 145° 40' East

Thursday May 8^d

Begins with fresh breezes from the Western board and pleases and working to the Eastward at 2 P.M. saw one whale lowered boats struck killed and towed to the ship middle part calm latter part light airs and pleasant employed cutting at 12 meridian finished cutting. Lat by act 41° 58' North
Long by obs 145° 41' East

Friday May 9^d

Begins with light airs from the Eastern board at 1 p.m. saw one whale lowered struck and the iron dred came on board took in sail and commenced boiling. middle part strong gales from the East split the maintop sail and took in the fore sail latter part tremendous gales slackened down tryworks. So Ends. No Observation

Saturday May 10^d

Begins with tremendous gales from E S E at 3 P.M. wind shifted to S N W and moderated at 7 P.M. set close reefed misson topsails middle part thick fog at daylight made sail and started tryworks at 11 A.M. saw one whale lowered boats could not get fast came on board. So Ends this day's work. Lat by obs 42° 58' North
Long by obs 145° 30' East
