

Remarks Sunday May 11th 1843

Begins with light breezy from the Southern board with thick dirty weather. untent maintop sail repaired and bent is again employed boiling. middle part fresh gale. latter part hard gale took in the foresail and stacked down by works. So Ends Lat by obs 42° 37' N Long by chro 149° 28' E

Monday May 12th

Begins with fresh gale from the Southern board heading to the Eastward at 1 PM set foresail and started by works at 7 PM were ship to the Westward middle part moderate. latter part pleasant at 11 A.M. saw whales lowered boats struck one killed and he sunk, came on board. So Ends this day Lat by obs 42° 48' N Long by chro 149° 11' East

Tuesday May 13th

Begins with fresh breezy from the Southern board employed stowing down and boiling at 3 PM saw whales lowered boats could not get fast - came on board at sunset took in sail. middle part pleasant. latter part finish boiling employed stowing down. So Ends Lat by obs 42° 42' N Long by chro 149° 37' East

Wednesday May 14th Begins with strong breezy from the S.W. heading S.E. by S. saw several whales. middle part thick fog. latter part the same employed in ship duty. So Ends with No Observation

Remarks Thursday May 15th 1843

Begins with strong breezy from the Southern board heading W by S with thick fog middle part the same latter part strong gale from the Western board heading S. under close reefed topsail. So Ends Lat by obs 42° 11' N Long by chro 149° 50' E

Friday May 16th

Begins with heavy gale from S.W. laying too under close reefed maintop sail at 1 PM hard gale with a heavy sea took in Waist and "Bow Sails" middle and latter parts the same. So Ends Lat 41° 45' N Long 150° 10' East

Saturday May 17th

Begins with strong gale from the Western board heading S by W at sunset more moderate set the foresail and close reefed misser topsail saw 3 right whales middle part moderate. latter part strong breezy from the S.W. saw whales lowered boats could not get fast. Lat 41° 26' N Long by chro 149° 16' East

Sunday May 18th

Begins with fresh gale from the Western board heading S.S.W. under close reefed topsail at 1 PM saw whales lowered boats struck one killed and took him to the ship and let him lay alongside all night at daylight commenced cutting at 11 finished. saw one whale going quick. So Ends Lat by obs 41° 08' N Long by chro 149° 34' East
