

Remarks Friday June 13th 1843
Begins with light air and foggy wind from the S. steering S. E. employed stowing down oil and line no whale in sight - middle and latter part thick fog.
So Ends Lat 35° 03'

Saturday June 14th
Begins with light air from the North with thick fog middle and latter part the same employed stowing down. So Ends Lat 42° 58' N Long 148° 42' East

Sunday June 15th
Begins with light breezes from the S. E. steering S. E. with pleasant weather set fore topmast studding sail middle part thick fog latter part the same at top gallant studding sail. So Ends No Obs

Monday June 16th
All these 24 hours light breezes from S. E. steering S. E. with thick fog. Hands employed in ships duty. So Ends No Observation

Tuesday June 17th
Begins with light breezes from the S. E. heading S. E. by E with thick fog took in studding sails middle and latter part strong breezes from E. S. E. heading S. E. by S with thick fog. So Ends. Lat by obs 47° 02' North Long by chro 149° 50' East

Remarks Wednesday June 18th 1843
Begins with strong breezes from S. E. by E heading S. E. with thick dirty weather saw several whales at 6 PM took in sail middle and latter part strong gales. So Ends Lat 44° 33' Long 154° 34' East

Thursday June 19th
Begins with fresh gales from E. S. E. heading S. E. by S at 3 pm saw the island of Wankoke and Stussin bearing South at 5 saw the Sater bearing S. S. E. at 40 miles at 8 PM were ship heading S. E. by E Rankine bearing S. N. W. dist 20 miles middle part fresh gales latter part strong gales land in sight. So Ends. No Obs

Friday June 20th
Begins with fresh breezes from the Eastern board heading S. E. with cloudy weather land in sight at 2 pm saw several whales to windward at sunset saw the isle of bearing S. W. middle part light air and bafflin latter part thick fog and calm So Ends No Obs

Saturday June 21st
Begins with a calm and thick fog middle part light air from S. E. latter part fresh breezes and thick weather. hands employed in ships duty. So Ends No Observation
