

Remarks Sunday June 22^d 1845
 Begins with strong breezes from S. S. E. steering E. S. E.
 with rain at 2 P. M. saw whales at 4 P. M. strong gales
 took in fore and mizzen top sails plenty of whales in sight
 middle part fresh gales. Latter part light winds
 from N. E. 18 with fog. P. Ends. Lat by obs 48° 21' N.
 Long by chro 138° 23' E.

Monday June 23^d

Begins with light breezes from the western board
 steering S. E. at 5 P. M. saw whales lowered boats
 struck and had to cut on account of the fog at
 sundown took in sail. middle part foggy. latter
 part cloudy saw whales lowered boats struck
 one and the iron dross got one boat stove
 came on board. P. Ends. No Observation

Tuesday June 24th

Begins with light airs and baffles saw whales lower
 could not get fast. middle part pleasant. latter part
 fresh gales from S. W. and rainy. saw whales. P. Ends
 Lat 48° 35' N. Long 160° 24' E

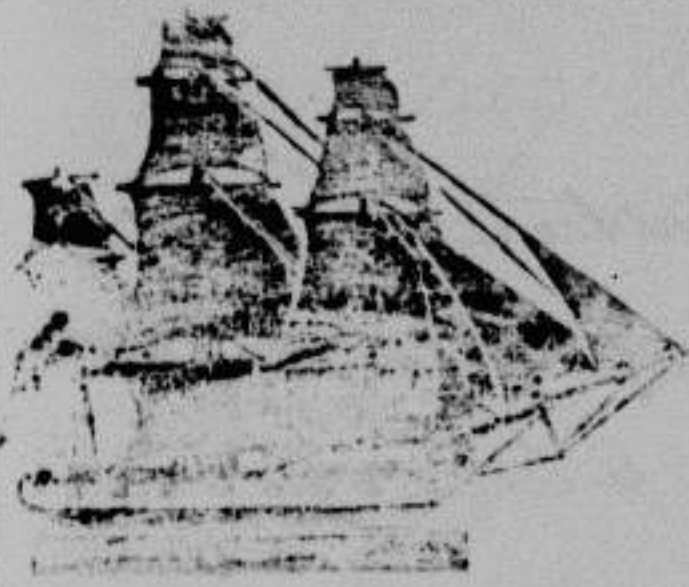
Wednesday June 25th

Begins with fresh gales from the S. W. with thick
 weather at 5 P. M. spoke barque Corn
 Perry of New London with 600 bbls plug
 of whales in sight. middle and latter parts
 strong gales from S. S. W. laying too. P. Ends
 this day Lat by obs 48° 40' N. Long by chro 160° 40' E



Remarks Thursday June 26th 1845

Begins with strong gales from the Northern board
 laying under short sail. saw several whales. Corn Perry
 in sight. Middle part the same. latter part
 strong gales with thick weather spoke
 ship Angelina of Havre de Grace with
 four whales this season. P. Ends this day
 Lat by observation 48° 15' North
 Long by chro 160° 00' East



Friday June 27th

Begins with strong gales from the Northern board laying
 under short sail on different tacks middle part the same
 latter part fresh gales with fog. saw several whales. P. Ends

Saturday June 28th

Begins with fresh gales from the Northern board with thick
 weather saw whales. middle part the same. latter part
 rainy. hands employed in ships duty. P. Ends No Obs

Sunday 29th

All these twenty four hours fresh gales from the
 Northern board with thick weather. saw whales lowered
 boats struck and the line parted. Came on board
 hands employed in ships duty. P. Ends No Obs
