

Remarks Monday June 30<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the Northern board with thick weather saw whales lowered could not get fast. middle part foggy. latter part the same. No Obs

Tuesday July 1<sup>st</sup>

Begins with light breezes from the Western board with thick fog at sunset fog cleared up saw whales middle and latter part thick fog. No Ends. No Observation

Wednesday July 2<sup>nd</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from the Western board with thick weather middle and latter part thick fog. No Ends No Obs

Thursday July 3<sup>rd</sup>

Begins with thick fog and ends with the same channels employed in ship's duty. No Ends. No Obs

Friday July 4<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours commencing with light breezes from the S.E. with thick fog middle part strong breezes latter part thick fog with heavy rain squalls and thunder and lightning. No Ends No Observation

Saturday July 5<sup>th</sup> All these 24 hours strong gales from the Northern board laying too under close reefed main top sail nothing in sight. No Ends Lat 59° N Long 158° 36' W

Remarks Sunday July 6<sup>th</sup> 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the Western board middle and latter part calm no whales in sight. hands employed in ship's duty. No Ends Lat by obs 48° 12' N Long by obs 160° 12' E

Monday July 7<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from the Northern board heading eastward at 6 P.M. saw whales lowered could not get fast middle and latter part foggy. No Ends. No Obs

Tuesday July 8<sup>th</sup>

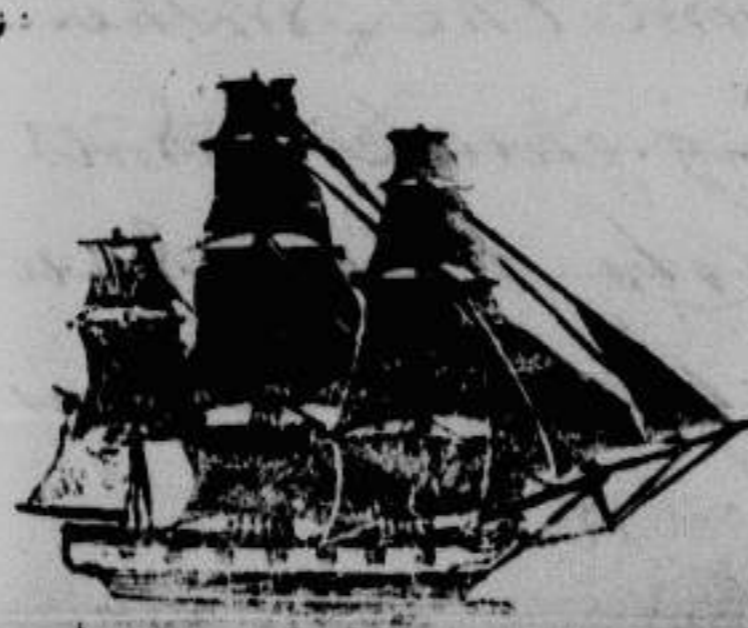
Begins with light breezes from the Northern board with thick fog heading W. & N.W. middle part light breezes from S.E. steering North latter part fresh breezes with fog and rain. No Ends No Obs

Wednesday July 9<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from the S.E. steering N.E. with thick rainy weather middle and latter part foggy. No Ends. No Observation

Thursday July 10<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light breezes from the Eastern board steering N.N.E. with thick fog middle part the same latter part fog cleared up. 14 sails in sight. No Ends with No Obs



Friday July 11<sup>th</sup> Begins with light breezes from the South middle part spoke ship Bonwick of New Bedford with 700 lbs. latter part foggy. No Ends with No Observation
