

Remarks Wednesday November 12<sup>th</sup> 1845  
 Begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. steering  
 East at 5 P.M. saw a dead whale at sunset took in sail  
 middle part fresh breezes at daylight made sail head  
 East saw a carcass at 8 A.M. saw one right whale  
 lowered boats could not get fast. Lat  $36^{\circ}33'$  South  
 Long  $166^{\circ}12'$  West

Thursday Nov 13<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from S.W. heading East took  
 in top gallant sails at sunset saw two right whales  
 took in sail middle part fresh gales latter part heading  
 East under double reefed topsails. Lat  $36^{\circ}18'$  South  
 Long  $165^{\circ}11'$  West

Friday Nov 14<sup>th</sup>

Begins with fresh gales from the S.W. heading to  
 the Eastward at 3 P.M. took in jib and spanker at  
 4 P.M. took in fore and main topsails and close reefed  
 the main, middle latter part strong gales with rain  
 So Ends Holby

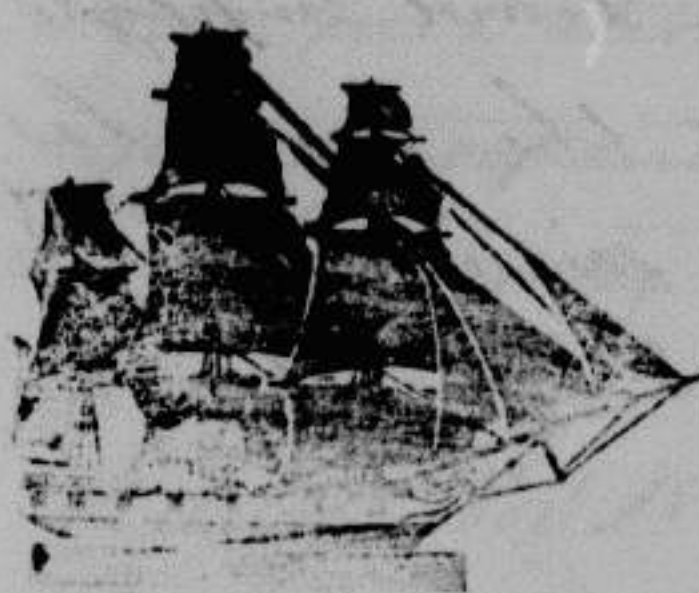
Saturday Nov 15<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong gales from the S. heading E. middle  
 part wind S.W. latter part made sail heading S.W.  
 nothing in sight. So Ends Lat  $35^{\circ}45'$  South

Sunday Nov 16<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong breezes from  
 S.W. heading S.E. middle part fresh gales latter part  
 the same saw 2 whales. So Ends Lat  $36^{\circ}40'$  South  
 Long  $165^{\circ}55'$  West

Remarks Monday November 17<sup>th</sup> 1845



Begins with strong gales from the S.W.  
 middle and latter part the same spoke  
 ship Hendon of New Bedford with  
 150 bbls of oil one gear out. So Ends  
 Lat by obs  $36^{\circ}12'S$  Long  $163^{\circ}28'W$

Tuesday Nov 18<sup>th</sup>



Begins with fresh breezes from S.W.  
 heading to the southward at 4 P.M.  
 saw right whale lowered boats  
 struck me killed him and took  
 him alongside and took in sail. at daylight began  
 cutting the whale at 8 A.M. finished cutting and made sail  
 started the tugworks. So Ends Lat by obs  $36^{\circ}39'$  South  
 Long by chr  $163^{\circ}21'W$

Wednesday Nov 19<sup>th</sup>

Begins with light air from the Western board and  
 pleasant employed boiling nothing in sight. middle  
 part the same latter part strong gales from the North  
 with rain. So Ends this day. Lat  $37^{\circ}12'$  South  
 Long  $163^{\circ}11'$  West

Thursday Nov 20<sup>th</sup>

Begins with strong gales from the Northern board with  
 thick rainy weather employed boiling middle part  
 clear finished boiling. latter part employed stowing down  
 So Ends Lat by observation  $37^{\circ}03'S$   
 Long by chronometer  $163^{\circ}49'W$
