

Remarks Tuesday December 2^d 1845
 Begins with fresh breezes from the Southern board with
 thick rainy weather steering South at dark took in
 sail middle part the same. latter part moderate made
 all sail steering S.E. So Ends Lat by obs 42° 20' N
 Long 162° 01' West

Wednesday Dec 3^d

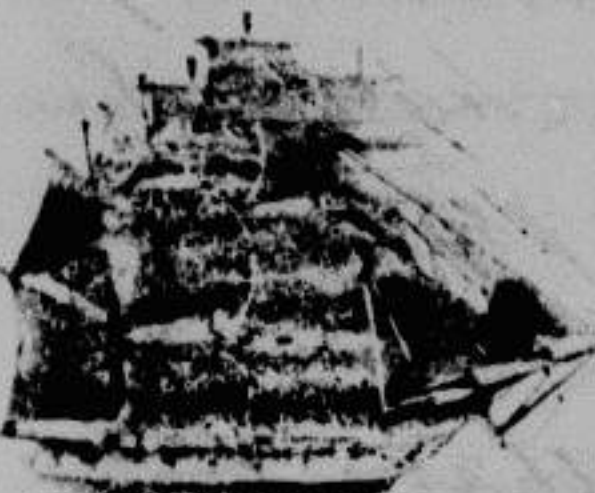
Begins with light breezes from the Western board and
 pleasant steering S.E. at 2 pm saw
 one right-whale lowered boat struck
 killed and took him to the ship and
 cut him in. middle part started by works latter part
 employed boiling. So Ends with No Observation

Thursday Dec 4th Begins with fresh breezes from
 the Southern board heading East no whale in sight middle
 part pleasant latter part strong breezes from the
 South steering E by S. employed boiling. Lat - 40° 06'

Friday Dec 5th

Begins with fresh gales from the Southern board
 with thick weather finished boiling at 4. Took strong
 gales took in fore and mizen topsails and close reefed
 the main topsail and hove too middle part the
 same latter part pleasant saw whale lowered boat
 could not get fast one sail in sight. So Ends this day
 Lat by obs 45° 40' South
 Long by chro 158° 50' West

Remarks Saturday December 6th 1845

Begins with fresh breezes from the Western board
 and pleasant steering S.E. at 1 P.M. spoke
 Barge Lussack of Sippican with 4 whales
 this season at sunset saw one whale low
 ered could not get fast middle part
 pleasant latter part fresh gales employed
 stowing down. So Ends two sail in sight. Lat 43° 38' S

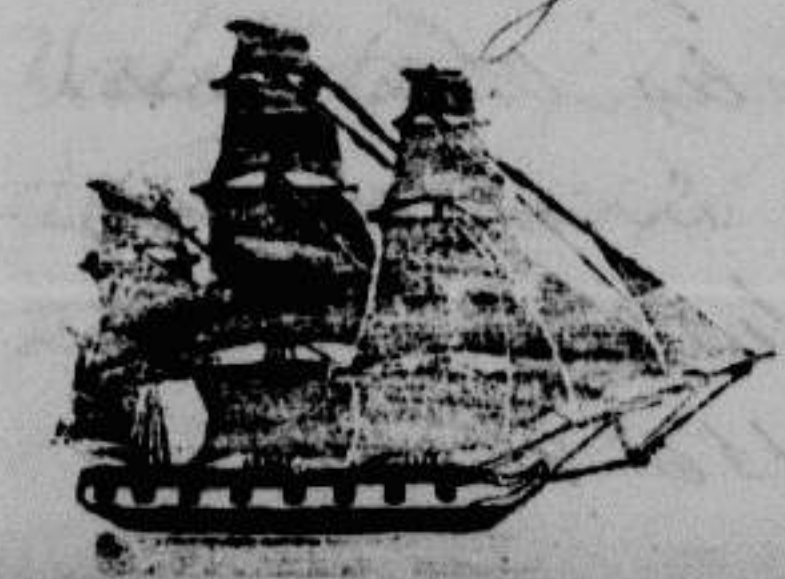
Sunday Dec 7th Begins with strong gales from the S.W.
 with rainy weather finish stowing down middle part the
 same. latter part made sail with strong breezes and sailing
 at 10 A.M. took in fore and mizen topsails. Lat 43° 55' S
 Long 150° 45' West

Monday Dec 8th

Begins with strong gales from the Western board middle
 part the same latter part pleasant nothing in sight. So
 Lat 44° 26' S. Long 160° 28' W.

Tuesday Dec 9th

Begins with light breezes from the Western board and
 pleasant steering Eastward one sail in sight middle and
 latter part wind from the South. Lat 44° 01' South
 Long 159° 25' West

Wednesday Dec 10th Begins with light breezes from
 the S.E. heading S.E. by E with cloudy
 weather middle part fresh gales. latter
 part strong breeze. spoke ship crews of
 New Bedford. So Ends Lat 43° 52' S. Long 158° 12' W.
