

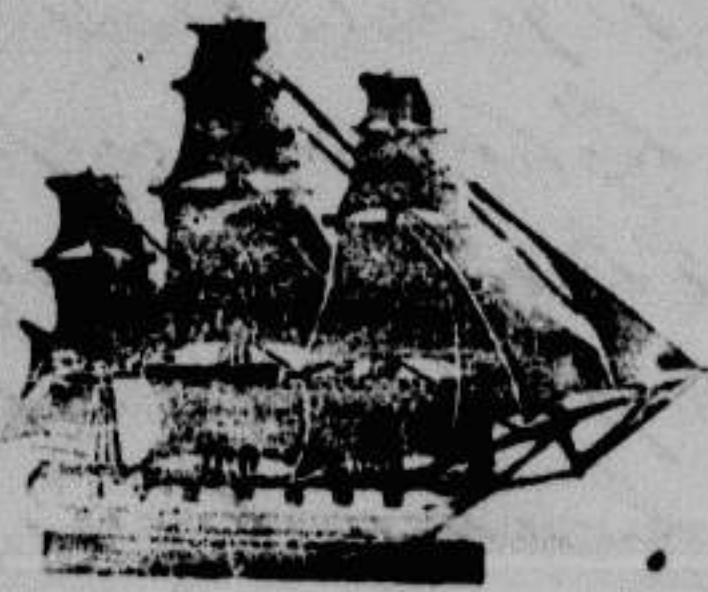
Remarks Thursday December 12th 1845
 Begins with strong breezes from the Northern board heading
 Eastward, middle part light breezes and bafflin latter part
 strong gales from the Southern board. Lat 44° 06' South
 Long 157° 38' West

Friday Dec 13th
 Begins with strong gales from the Southern board
 laying too at 4 P.M. and hauled to the East - wore ship
 heading S S E middle part the same, latter part light
 air and bafflin nothing in sight. Lat 44° 35' South
 Long 158° 20' West

Saturday Dec 14th
 Begins with light air and bafflin middle part the
 same, latter part wind from the Northern board steering
 S E. So Ends. Lat 45° 10' South
 Long 157° 40' West

Sunday Dec 15th
 Begins with light air and bafflin, middle part fresh
 breezes from the Western board latter part strong gales
 So Ends. So Ends

Monday Dec 16th
 All these 24 hours strong gales from the
 Western board spoke ship -
 Mountains of New Bedford with 900
 bbls of oil. 2 whales this season
 handy employed in ships duty -
 So Ends. Lat 45° 16' South
 Long 156° 9' West



Remarks Tuesday December 16th 1845
 Begins with strong breezes from the Northern board head-
 ing to the East nothing in sight middle part the same
 latter part strong breezes. So Ends. Lat 45° 12' South
 Long 155° 17' West

Wednesday Dec 17th
 Begins with strong breezes from the Northern board
 steering S E at 3 P.M. saw one right whale lowered
 could not get fast middle part
 the same latter part saw whales
 lowered struck one killed him &
 took him alongside. So Ends. Lat 45° 10' South
 Long 154° 14' West



Thursday Dec 18th
 Begins with strong gales from the Northern board out-
 in the whale, middle part heading West employed
 boiling latter part fresh gales from the Northern board
 heading West. So Ends. Lat 45° 32' South
 Long 154° 13' West

Friday Dec 19th
 Begins with fresh gales from the Western board
 employed boiling middle part finish boiling latter part
 strong gales from the S S W. Lat 45° 28' South
 Long 153° 38' West

Saturday Dec 20th Begins with strong gales from the
 West - we sail in sight middle and latter part the
 same employed clearing home. So Ends 44° 58' South
 Long 152° 45' West
