

Remarks Sunday April 19th 1846
Begins with moderate breezes. middle part the
same. latter part fresh gales with rain squally
cooled down tryworks. I sail in sight steering
S. E. to Endz. No Observation

Monday April 20th
Begins with heavy gales and rain. middle
part the same. latter part moderate started
the tryworks. stowed down 50 bbls of oil.

Tuesday April 21st
Begins with fresh gales from the S. W. middle
part moderate. latter part saw plenty of finbacks
employed stowing down. S. E. Ends

Wednesday April 22^d
Begins with fresh gales from the Southern board
steering S. W. middle part foggy. latter part
pleasant saw eight whales lowered could not
get fast. Lat 41° 20' S. Long 149° 15' East

Thursday April 23^d
Begins with light air and calm at 4 PM
saw whales lowered but could not get fast.
middle part pleasant. latter part fresh
gales. I sail in sight.

Remarks on Board Friday April 24th
Commences with fresh gales from the S. W. middle
part the same. latter part moderate saw
whales. lowered boats struck one killed him
and he sunk. three sail in sight. S. E. Ends
Lat by Obs 41° 54' S. Long 149° 10' East

Saturday April 25th
Begins with fresh gales from the S. W. saw 2 whales
lowered boats but could not get fast. middle and
latter parts strong gales and foggy. Lat 42° 27' S.
Long by Chron 148° 11' E

Sunday April 26th
All these 24. hours strong gales from the Southern
Board laying to saw two ships steering North.
Lat 42° 17' S. Long by Chron 148° 20' E

Monday April 27th
Begins with strong gales from the S. E. with thick
rainy weather middle part the same heading
S. S. W. latter part wind from the Western board.
saw a ship standing S. E. to Endz Lat 41° 56' S.
Long 147° 55' East

Tuesday April 28th. Begins with fresh breezes from
the Western board heading S. at 4 p. m. saw whales lowered
boats but could not get fast. middle part calm. latter part
strong gales from the North. S. E. Ends. No Obs.
