Commenced with strong gales from the Northern Board with
fog and rain. middle part the same. latter part light
breezes from the West. saw whales lowered boats struck me
killed and took

alongside. So Ends

Long

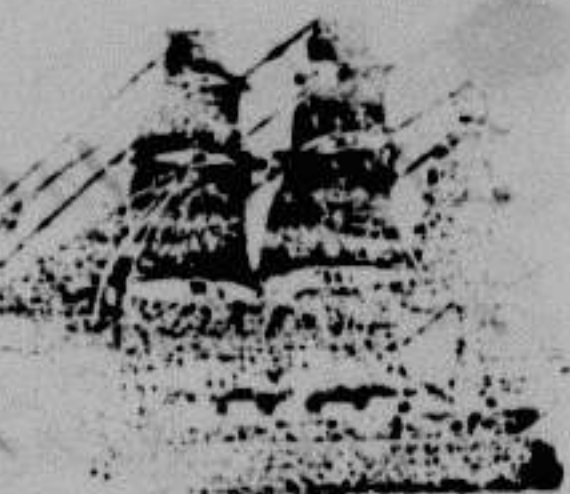
Thursday April 30th

Begins with a calm at 3 P.M. began cutting. spike ship
Catched of Hame & Dace with one whale
this season at 9 finish cutting latter
part fresh breezes from the South em-
ployed boiling. So Ends. So Ob



Friday May 1st 1846

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southern Board strong
W. & N. at 5 p.m. spike ship Alexander
Coffin of New Bedford 18 months out 900
bbls of oil. middle and latter party
employed boiling. So Ends. this day
Lat 42° 05' N. Long 143° 25' East.



Saturday May 2nd Begins with light breezes
from the S.W. heading S. S. middle part the same
latter part saw one whale lowered boats could not get
fast. Employed stowing down. So Ends

Lat by Obs 41° 45' North
Long by Chron 143° 33' East.

Remarks on Board Sunday May 3rd 1846. I. King
Begins with light breezes from S. & E. heading S. E. finished
boiling at 8 p.m. saw whales lowered boats did not strike at
5 p.m. took in sail with thick snow squalls middle and
latter party strong gales from the Southern Board. So Ends
Lat 41° 15' N. Long 145° 00' East.

Monday May 4th

Begins with strong gales from the North heading E. & E.
middle part the same latter part more moderate employed
stowing down with nothing in sight. Lat. 41° 16' North
Long 145° 43' East

Tuesday May 5th

Begins with light breezes from the Western Board
heading North at 5 p.m. saw whales lowered boats
could not get fast. two sail in sight one boiling
Middle part the same. latter part light air from
the South saw one whale. So Ends. Lat 41° 33' North
Long 147° 56' East

Wednesday May 6th

Begins with fresh breezes from the South steering
S. East nothing in sight but water middle and
latter party fresh gales from S. with thick weather
So Ends. So Ob

Thursday May 7th

Begins with strong gales from the Southern Board
with thick weather heading N. by E. middle part
the same. latter part calm. saw one whale going
quick. Lat. 41° 49' N. Long 147° 15' East.
