

Remarks on Board Friday May 8th 1846
 Begins with light breezes from the Southern board
 steering West - middle part the same, latter part
 pleasant, nothing in sight. Lat 41° 45' South
 Long 146° 04' East

Saturday May 9th

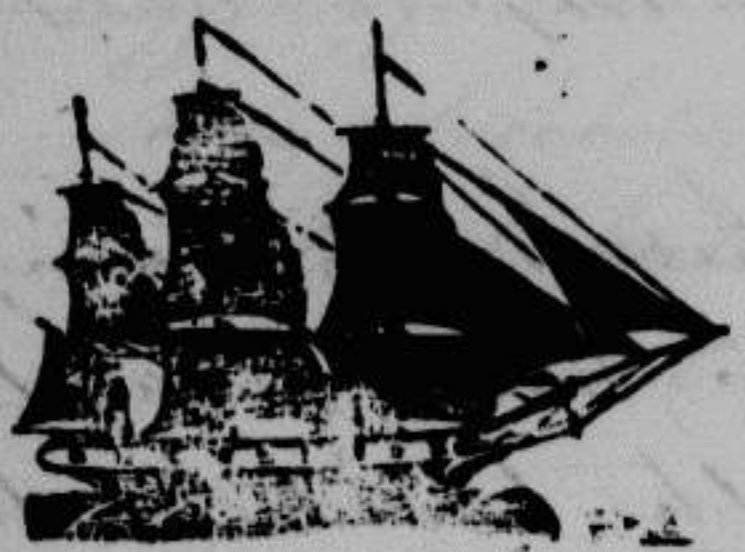
Begins with light breezes from S.W. by S with thick
 fog heading S.E. middle part the same latter part
 rainy. So ends this day. No Observation -

Sunday May 10th

Commences with light breezes from the S.W. with fog
 middle and latter parts fresh breezes from the Western
 board, with nothing in sight. Lat by Obs 41° 31' S
 Long by Chron 145° 44' E

Monday May 11th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Western board
 spoke ships Morrison
 of New London with
 one whale this season
 ship Batchelor of Naure
 with two whales, middle



and latter parts fresh breezes saw two whales. So ends
 Lat 41° 36' S Long 145° 36' E

Tuesday May 12th Begins with strong breezes from
 the W. saw several whales lowered boats to
 one at dark cut from him middle part middle
 latter part saw whales could not strike Lat 41° 55' S

Remarks Wednesday May 13th 1846. S. Chief -
 Begins with fresh breezes from the South East
 middle and latter parts light breezes saw whales
 lowered boats struck one killed him and he
 sunk. So ends this day. Lat by Obs 41° 59' S
 Long by Chron 145° 33' E

Thursday May 14th

Begins with light winds from the Eastern board
 saw two whales lowered boats could not get fast came
 on board, middle and latter parts strong breezes. So ends
 Lat by Obs 42° 09' S Long by Chron 145° 33' E

Friday May 15th

Begins with strong breezes from the Eastern board saw
 one whale lowered boats struck him and the iron dred
 and away he went saw a ship steering South
 middle and latter parts thick fog. So ends
 Lat by Obs 42° 15' S Long 145° 21' E

Saturday May 16th

Commences with strong breezes from S.E. heading
 S.W. under close sail with thick fog and rain, middle
 part the same, latter part pleasant. So ends
 No Observation -

Sunday May 17th

Begins with light breezes from S.W. steering S.W. saw a
 whale lowered struck killed and took to the ship
 him day all night at daylight he
 gam cutting at 9 AM finished and
 made sail. So ends. Lat 42° 03' S Long 145° 50' E
