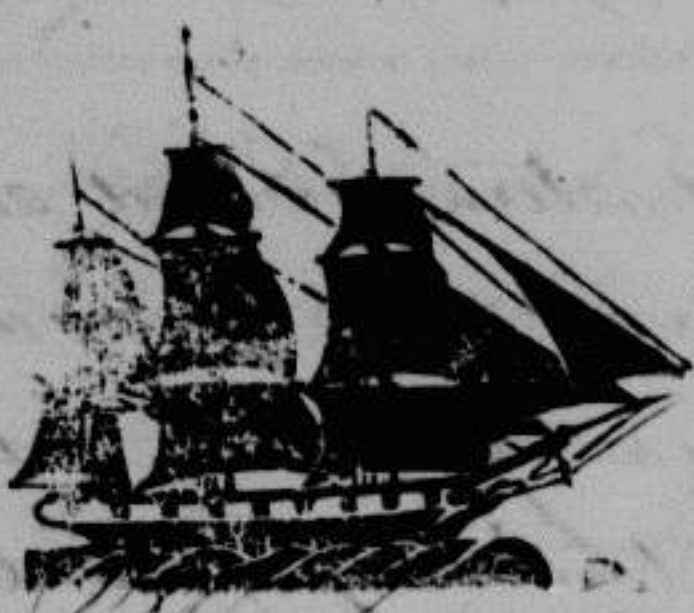


Remarks on Board Monday May 18th 1846
 Begins with light breezes from the S.W. heading E. & at
 2 pm saw whales lowered boats
 struck two got cut from one and
 other spouting thick of the fog. No Ends
 lowered boats two boats stove
 had to leave the flood on account
 with hard luck.
 .. No Observation

Tuesday May 19th

Begins with fresh breezes from the Western Board
 and pleasant. saw two whales lowered boats but
 did not strike. middle part started
 the trawling latter part employed
 boiling. Spoke ship Paratoga of New
 Bedford with one whale. No Ends
 Lat 41° 52' N. Long 149° 10' East



Wednesday May 20th

Begins with strong breezes from the S.W. heading
 S.W. by W. Under shot sail middle part the same
 latter part calm two sail in sight employed boiling.
 Lat 41° 25' N. Long 148° 32' E

Thursday May 21st

Begins with light breezes from S.W. with thick
 rainy weather steering S.W. a 10 finished boiling
 middle part the same. latter part employed steering
 down. No Ends. Lat by Obs. 41° 32' North
 Long by Chron 148° 36' East

Remarks on Board Friday May 22nd 1846.
 Commences with light breezes from the Western Board
 with thick weather middle and latter part wind from
 the Eastern Board with fog squally saw one whale
 lowered boats could not get fast. Lat. 41° 40' N
 Long. 148° 17' E

Saturday May 23rd

Begins with strong breezes from the Eastern Board
 with thick rainy weather at 2 pm took in sail mid-
 dle and latter part snow and rain. Lat 41° 45' N
 Long 148° 57' E

Sunday May 24th

Begins with strong breezes from the West made sail
 middle and latter part light breezes from the South
 with nothing in sight. Lat by Obs 42° 05' N
 Long by Chron 148° 50' E

Monday May 25th

Begins with light winds from the Southern Board
 and pleasant. saw 2 whales lowered boats struck
 one killed him and took him
 alongside middle part getting ready
 for cutting at daylight began cutting at 9 AM
 finished and made sail. No Ends. Lat 42° 20' N
 Long 148° 59' E

Tuesday May 26th Begins with fresh breezes from
 the Eastern Board with thick fog employed boil-
 ing. middle and latter parts the same. No Ends
 .. No Observation.
