

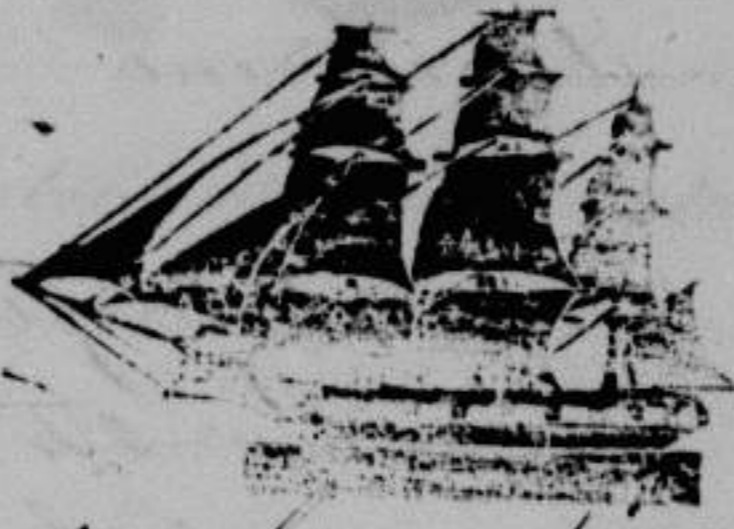
Remarks on Board Monday July 13th 1846
 Commenced with strong breezes from the Southern
 Board made sail at 3 P.M.
 saw whales lowered boats and
 struck one killed him and
 took him alongside middle part pleasant getting
 ready for cutting at daylight began cutting at 12
 finished. So ends. Lat 51.56. S Long 160.07 E

Tuesday July 14th

Begins with light airs from the Western Board
 started to work again middle part pleasant latter
 part the same saw whales lowered boats and chased
 Land bearing S. S. dist 50 miles. So ends

Wednesday July 15th

Begins with fresh breezes from the S.W. saw several
 whales lowered and chased spoke
 Ship Francis Henrietta of New
 Bedford with 5 whales. middle
 and latter pleasant
 parts at 9 A.M. saw whales lowered struck one killed
 him and took him alongside got two hats stove
 took them in employed getting ready for cutting. So
 Latitude 50.37 S
 Longitude 159.17 East



Remarks on Board Thursday July 16th 1846

All these 24 hours light winds and pleasant cut in
 the whale employed stowing down and boiling. So ends
 Lat 51.12 S. Long 159.28 East

Friday July 17th

Begins with light winds and pleasant middle part
 the same latter part strong breezes from S. S. employed
 boiling. So ends. Lat 51.20 South Long 159.31 East

Saturday July 18th

Begins with strong breezes from the S.W. employed boiling
 and stowing down middle part finish boiling latter
 part stowing down. So ends Latitude 51.05 South
 Longitude 160.10 East

Sunday July 19th

Begins with strong breezes from the Southern Board
 employed stowing down middle part fresh gales latter part
 strong gales from the South. So ends. Lat. 51.21 S
 Long 160.19 East

Monday July 20th

All these 24 hours strong gales from the S.W.
 employed repairing boats. So ends. Lat 51.39 S
 Long 160.27 E

Tuesday July 21st

Begins with fresh breezes from the Southern Board
 employed stowing down middle and latter parts light
 breezes with thick fog employed putting up sheets
 Latitude 51.19 S. Longitude 159.47 E
