

Remarks on Board Wednesday July 22nd 1846
 Begins with light breezes from the S.E. with thick fog
 middle part the same. latter part thick rainy weather.
 saw whales lowered boats struck two killed them one went
 off spouting thick blood the other
 took alongside. So Ends this day.

Lat by Obs 31° 35' South
 Long by Chron 159° 23' East.

Thursday July 23rd

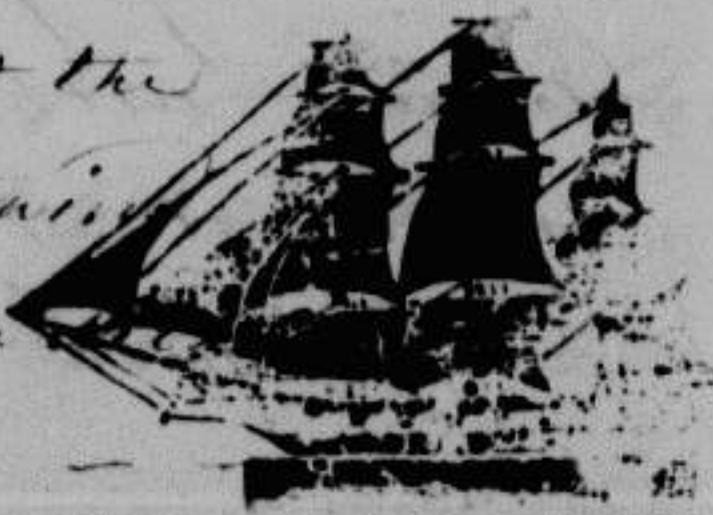
Begins with thick rainy weather began cutting at 5 AM
 finish cutting middle part employed clearing up the
 decks and started by work. at 10 A.M. saw whales lowered
 boats struck one and the iron died out. got
 one boat stowed. So Ends. No Observation.

Friday July 24th

Begins with light winds from the S.E. and foggy middle
 and latter parts rain squalls employed boiling and setting
 up phocks. So Ends. Lat 31° 16' S. Long 159° 53' East

Saturday July 25th All these 24 hours light air from the
 S.E. and foggy employed boiling. So Ends. No Obs

Sunday July 26th Begins with winds from
 the S.E. with fog and rain middle part the
 same finished boiling. latter part stowing
 down. Spoke ship Sophie of Worcester
 10 whales this season. So Ends.



Remarks on Board Monday July 27th 1846
 Begins with light winds and bafflin employed stowing down
 water and clearing up between decks. middle and latter part
 strong breezes from the W.S.W. employed stowing down oil.

Lat 31° 16' South. Long 159° 35' East

Tuesday July 28th

Begins with fresh gales from W.S.W. employed stowing down
 and setting up phocks. middle part the same. latter part strong
 gales nothing in sight. So Ends. Lat 31° 26' S. Long 159° 45' E

Wednesday July 29th

Begins with strong breezes from S.W. heading in for the
 land. middle part standing off. latter
 part fresh gales at 11 A.M. saw a dead
 whale took it alongside. So Ends. Lat 31° 39' S. Long 159° 57' East.

Thursday July 30th

Begins with fresh gales from the Western Board out in
 the whale middle and latter part fresh gales employed
 boiling. Latitude 30° 02' S. Longitude 159° 20' East

Friday July 31st

Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W. saw
 whales going quick lowered boats but could not get fast.
 middle and latter parts thick fog employed boiling
 So Ends this day. Latitude by Account 30° 31' S. Long
 Longitude by Account 159° 33' East
