All these 24 hours light breezes and pleasant. 4 ships
came in and anchored watch on liberty. So Ends

Monday Oct 5th

All these 24 hours light breezes and pleasant em-
ployed painting ship. So ends. this day

Tuesday Oct 6th

These 24 hours pleasant weather watch on liberty

Wednesday Oct 7th These 24 hours calm weather
employed painting ship. watch on liberty. So ends

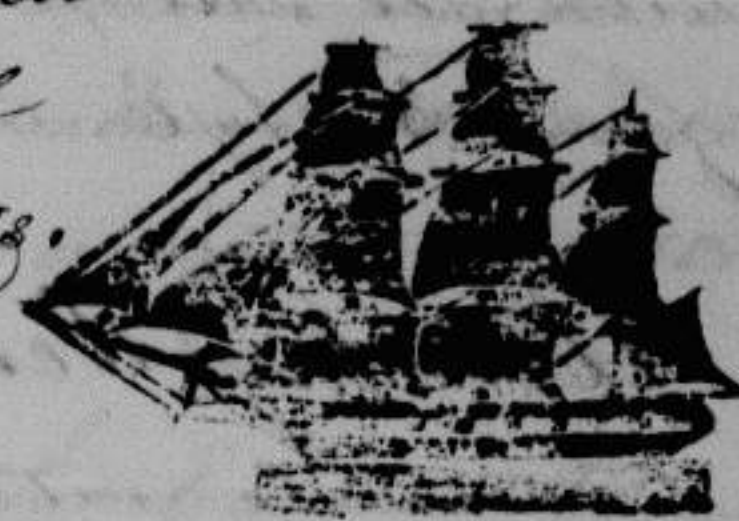
Thursday Oct 8th All these 24 hours pleasant
weather all hands on board. So Ends

Friday Oct 9th All these 24 hours pleasant
employed getting off water and Potatoes. So Ends

Saturday Oct 10th All these 24 hours pleasant
shipped on board of the Charles of Boston 24
bundles of Whalibone for America. So Ends

Sunday Oct 11th Begins with light and bafflin
windy at 6 till got underway and stood out
into the passage.

Remarks on Board Monday October 12th 1846
Begins with light winds and bafflin
spoke ship George Washington of New
London with 300 bbls of sperm oil
and 2000 BBS of rights. So Ends.



Tuesday Oct 13th

All these 24 hours light airs and bafflin heading
Southward. Employed in ship's duty.

Wednesday Oct 14th

All these 24 hours fresh winds from E. S. E. heading
to the Southward. Lat 15° 13' N. Long. 155° 57' W.

Thursday Oct 15th These 24 hours fresh breezes
from E. S. E. heading South. employed in ship's duty.
Lat 16° 44' N. Long 156° 31' W.

Friday Oct 16th

All these 24 hours fresh winds from the Eastern
Board heading S. S. E. the ship heaving 500 strokes
an hour. No Observations --

Saturday Oct 17th

Begins with fresh winds from the Eastern Board
heading S. S. E. with cloudy weather. middle and
latter parts the same. Lat by obs. 18° 09' N. E.
Longitude by chr. 158° 06' W.
