S E by E with all sail set. Lat 6° 56' S. Long 157° 28' W

Saturday Oct 31st

All these 24 hours light breezes from N E & steering
S E. employed in ships duty. Lat 8° 15' S. Long 156° 17' West

Sunday Nov 1st

Begins with light breezes from N E & steering S E mid-
dle and latter parts fresh breezes with rain equally
Lat 10° 11' S. Long 155° 28' W

Monday Nov 2nd

Begins with strong winds from the Northern Board
steering S. S E middle and latter parts rain equally
with thunder and lightning. Lat 12° 00' S. Long 155° 10' West.

Tuesday Nov 3rd

Begins with fresh winds from the Northern Board and
equally steering S by E. middle part steering South
latter part steering S by E. Lat 13° 18' S. Long 155° 08' West.

Wednesday Nov 4th

Begins with fresh winds from E. S E steering S by E
middle and latter parts wind from the N E
employed mending sails. Lat 15° 14' S. Long 155° 58' West

Thursday Nov 5th

Begins with light breezes from the N E steering S by E
with all sail set. middle part wind from E. S E. latter
part the same. Lat 17° 17' S. Long 156° 41' West

Friday Nov 6th

All these 24 hours fresh breezes from the N E steering
S by E with all set. Lat 18° 58' S. Long 157° 50' West

Saturday Nov 7th

Begins with fresh breezes from the N E steering S E
at 4 P M spoke the Hague Suspension of Day
Harbour with 1200 lbs bound to New
Zealand middle part the same latter
part high winds from N E as 7 P M
saw the island of Otaheite at a
distance 15 miles. Lat 20° 02' S. Long 158° 47' W



Sunday Nov 8th

All these 24 hours strong winds from the S E head-
ing S. S E spoke ship's servant of
Day Harbour with 1600 lbs as 11 P M
saw the island of Rotonga -
distance 35 miles. S. End
Latitude 20° 59' S. Long
Longitude 160° 00' West
