 August 7th 1835  
 Ship Isaac Howland from  
 these 24 hours begin with strong gales  
 from the SW and flying clouds heading  
 WNW at 8 P.M. tackel ship to the SSE  
 Middle & Latter part strong breezes from  
 SW to S close hauld upon A wind  
 heading from SSE to ESE All built A  
 scil room and stowed the spare sails  
 ship under single reef to sails so ends  
 this day  
 Lat by Obs 61° 5' S  
 Long by Watch 17° 23' West

Saturday  
 August 8th 1835  
 Commences with strong SSW winds and  
 flying clouds heading SE under single reef  
 B. Dail's watch employed in various duties  
 at 10 P.M. wore ship to the WNW  
 Middle and Latter part strong breezes  
 so ends this day  
 Lat by Obs 61° 45' S  
 Long by Chronometer 18° 00' West

Sunday  
 August 9th 1835  
 Begins with strong SW winds and  
 flying clouds heading to the SE and  
 SSE at 9 P.M. tackel ship to the  
 WNW Middle part more moderate  
 made scil Latter part quite moderate  
 and smooth so ends this day  
 Lat by Obs 61° 10' S  
 Long by Chronometer 17° 28' W

Monday  
 August 10th 1835  
 Begins with light SW winds and clear  
 weather all drawing scil so heading  
 to the SSE at 8 P.M. in the act of  
 setting the flying jib tore it the  
 width of 3 fathoms Middle & Latter  
 part strong breezes and cloudy  
 with some rain still unbent the  
 flying jib and repaired it so ends  
 this day  
 Lat by Obs 61° 10' S  
 Long by Watch 16° 29' W

the  
 Tuesday  
 August 11th 1835  
 Azoras towards Cape Horn,  
 these 24 hours begin with fresh SW by S  
 winds and cloudy with frequent showers of  
 rain at 1 P.M. tackel ship to the W by N  
 Middle part strong breezes and clear at  
 2 P.M. out Mr. S. J. scil wind hauling  
 gradually to the South All repairing  
 the on Old M. Sail at Meridian Wind S  
 heading up W & W so ends this day  
 Lat by Obs 41° 27' S  
 Long 14° 37' West

Wednesday  
 August 12th 1835  
 Begins with strong breezes from the South and  
 flying clouds heading up W & W with  
 employed repairing on old Main sail on other  
 necessary jobs Middle & Latter part more  
 moderate so T. P. M. S. J. scil so ends this  
 day  
 Lat. Obs 31° 15' S  
 Long 20° 54' W

Thursday  
 August 13th 1835  
 Begins with moderate gales from the SSE & SE  
 and good weather heading up W & W  
 SW by W all drawing scil so Middle part  
 fresh breezes Latter part the same at Merid  
 in Wind SSE heading up SW All saw  
 an English ship steering to the Southward  
 exchanged colors with her Watch employed  
 fitting a new fore course for bending  
 so ends this day  
 Lat by Obs 21° 01' S  
 Long 23° 04' West

Friday  
 August 14th 1835  
 begins with strong breezes from the SSE and  
 flying clouds heading up SW with all  
 drawing sail so at 10 P.M. to percel  
 for Blackfish killed one and took him  
 alongside Latter part fine winds from the  
 SSE and clear so ends this day  
 Lat by Obs 00° 23' N  
 Long by DR 24° 00' West
