 July 5 cloudy heading up West at 7 P.M. heading
 1836 to the SE. Highest again at 10 P.M. all
 saw breeches to the windward so ends this
 day

Wednesday These 24 hours fresh S and SSE winds
 July 6 heading from N & W to SW middle part
 1836 rainy latter part clear saw porpoises
 30 miles this day Dist by Chronometer
 Long by Chron 84° 20' West

Thursday First part of these 24 hours moderate
 July 7 South winds and clouds heading up
 1836 N & W with M. S. G. sail set so ends
 this day

Friday These 24 hours strong South winds
 July 8 and flying clouds heading up S & W by W
 1836 Employed setting up 8 boards & 2 sails
 this day Dist by Chron 88 miles W
 Long by Chron 66° 30' W

Saturday First part of these 24 hours strong
 July 9 SSE winds heading up S & W at 6 P.M.
 1836 single reefed the G. & H. Stizen topsails
 latter part more moderate set the M.
 T. G. sail so ends these 24 hours
 Dist by Chron 8° 19' 10" S
 Long by Chron 88° 40' 10" W

Sunday These 24 hours strong SSE winds and
 July 10 cloudy heading up S & W at 6 P.M. made
 1836 Chartum Island bearing South at 9 miles
 James' Island bearing N by S and ran for it
 so ends this day

Bounded off shore on a Cruise
 Monday These 24 hours fresh S & SE winds and clear
 July 11 at 9 P.M. came to anchor on the
 1836 North side of James Island All all
 hands on shore searching the woods for
 Terapin so ends this day

Tuesday Pleasant winds and weather all
 July 12 hands employed on shore backing down
 1836 Terapin

Wednesday Employed as yesterday
 July 13 1836

Thursday A 6 P.M. came off with the list of
 July 14 our terapin at 7 P.M. got underweigh
 1836 with 200 large bull & cow terapin
 and 100 chicken & shared to the West
 so ends this day

Friday First part of these 24 hours moderate
 July 15 gales from the SE and clear at
 1836 3 P.M. raised a school of sperm
 whales lowered 4 boats fastened to
 and killed 3 of them at 6 P.M. took them
 to the ship The North head of James
 Island Dist 8 miles All cut them
 in and began to boil so ends this day
