October 25th Fresh SE trades and unsettled weather standing SE at 2 AM tacked South Employed setting up shrouds & nothing in sight
Lat by Obs 55° 55' South

Wednesday
October 26th Strong trades throughout working to windward with single reefs in foremast Employed setting up shrouds sailors greasing & oiling ships A. scrapping & nothing in sight
Lat 6° 00' South

Thursday
October 27th Fresh trades throughout working to windward under easy sail nothing in sight
Lat 6° 40' South

Friday
October 28th Strong gales and clear nothing in sight P. M. watches variously employed.

Saturday
October 29th 1836 Fresh trades and clear plying to windward under easy sail nothing in sight all hands as savage as meat axes No Obs

Whaling in the Pacific Ocean in 36

Sunday
October 30th These 24 hours strong trades and clear working to windward under easy sail saw ^{the} carcass of a whale
Lat by Obs 55° 57' 30"
Long by Obs 102° 57' West

Monday
October 31st 1836 Fresh trades and cloudy at 6 AM bore up and runs NW nothing in sight shifted jibs about the spearker and mended it &c

Tuesday
November 1st Strong SE trades and cloudy steering West at 6 PM hauled on the main and shortened sail for the night at 7 AM stored SW nothing in sight
Lat by Obs 55° 57' 30"
Long by Gun Obs 102° 21' West

Wednesday
November 2nd Strong SE trades and cloudy standing NE single reefs in at 7 AM tacked South, employed variously Nothing in sight
Lat by Obs 54° 05'

Thursday
November 3rd 1836 Winds and weather as yesterday Nothing in sight so mended the deck
