Thursday These 24 hours squally with rain all day saw whales no chance of getting them
February 22nd 1837
Ship George boat in place which not yet fast
Lat by obs 5.28 S

Friday Squally with rain at 6 PM single vessel and hauled the course at 5 saw a breadth to windward at 7 AM raised a school of whales toward 4 boats did not succeed in fastening at 11 lowered without success whales smaller than hawks, 3 ships in sight
February 23rd 1837
Lat 5.16 South

Saturday At 2 PM spoke ship George of Amherst in company with ships Weston Scott of A and George of N.B. millle part strong trade latter part moderate working to windward so ends this day
February 24th 1837
Lat by obs 4.57

Sunday These 24 hours squally with heavy showers of rain working to windward under short sail several ships in sight working to windward no whales in sight that appears to be the hardest
February 25th 1837

Monday These 24 hours strong trades and cloudy working to windward under easy sail
February 26th 1837
Lat 5.2 South

Tuesday Winds and weather as yesterday
February 27th
Lat 5 South

Wednesday Begins with strong N.E. trades and cloudy at 6 PM touched
February 28th
L.E. saw 2 ships to the north latter part light winds so ends this day
Lat obs

Thursday These 24 hours strong trades and hazy weather working to windward under easy sail nothing in sight spoke ship Thornton Fair Haven
February 29th 1837
Lat by obs 4.40 South
Gone by sun 106.10 West
Do by obs 106.12 West

Friday Winds and weather as yesterday dry times employed grafting
February 29th 1837

several ships in sight
