latter part fresh winds so ends this
day

April 16th A heavy swell from the Southward
nothing in sight
Lat by Obs 30° 08' S
Long by L. R. 83° 15' W

Monday Begins with light S. E. winds and clear
April 17th weather steering S. E. by compass saw
finbacks & saw fish watches employed
spinning yarns & end with calm weather
Lat by Obs 29° 25' S
Long by L. R. 86° 28' W

Tuesday Commences with light S. E. by S winds
and beautiful weather middle &
April 18th latter part calm and clear launch
in the forenoon and covered in the
wake of the cap set up the head
stays &c

Wednesday First part light airs from the
April 19th S. W. and clear course E. S. E. by
compass middle & latter part
much the same as the first
saw finbacks watches variously
employed
Lat by Obs 29° 08' S
Long by L. R. 84° 35' W

Thursday Commences with light northerly
April 20th airs and clear weather
course E. S. E. by compass
middle and latter part calm
All caught a noble dolphin
with a pair of grains
Lat by Obs 29° 09' S

Friday First and middle part calm
April 21st at 7 all wind at S. E. and
clear course E. S. E. nothing in sight
the Carpenter making a pair of
wheel blocks and the blacksmith iron
striking them
Lat by Obs 28° 48' S Long 82° 20' W
