Saturday

April 22
1837

Begins with fresh E winds and
passing clouds Course E by E by compass
at 5 Bell wind at E by E Latter part
strong breezes and rough sea at
midnight took in the Fore & Main
Top Gallant sails & Tying jib

Lat by Obs 28° 06' North
Long by Chron 80° 26' West

Sunday

April 23
1837

Commences with strong North Easterly
winds and rough weather
heaving up from W to E by E
at 2 Bell hauled the M. T. & R.
at 10 Bell single reefed the
topsails Latter part more moderate
made sail

Lat by Obs 27° 17' North

Monday

April 24
1837

Commences with strong E winds
and cloudy Course E by E at
6 Bell single reefed the topsails
Latter part more moderate set
whole topsails and main T. & R. sail
ends this day Lat 26° 20' North

Tuesday

April 25
1837

Commences with strong E winds
and cloudy steering off E by E
Latter part light winds and clear
s. cloudy

Wednesday

April 21
1837

These 24 hours light baffling winds
and cloudy steering from W to E by E
saw blackfish and codfish shifted the
main & main top gallant sails Fore & Main
topsails and jib

Lat by D. R. 24° 30' N
Long by Do 72° 00' West

Thursday

April 22
1837

Commences with light Easterly winds
and cloudy heading up W by W
Middle and Latter part calm and
clear saw blackfish

Lat by Obs 23° 25' North
Long by Chronom 73° 30' West

Friday

April 23
1837

First & Latter part light winds
from the South and clear
Middle part calm at 7 Bell
lowered 3 bails for blackfish
fastened to 1 and drew from him
fastened to A large codfish and
took him to the Ship

Saturday

April 24
1837

First part strong breezes and cloudy
Middle and Latter part light
winds saw a Ship steering W by W
watched employed taring down the
standing rigging courses from W by W
to E by E

Lat by Obs 22° 00' N
Long by A Smer Obs 70° 36' W
